Orangeville hosts 8 Miles of Ag-tiques farm equipment show

ORANGEVILLE — 8 Miles of Ag-tiques began on Highway 26 north of Orangeville and Each stop featured different equipment including John Deere, Massey Harris, International Harvester, Oliver, Minneapolis-Moline, Allis Chalmers and other old machinery from the Good Old Days.

Larry Nordmeyer was one of the dozens of collectors exhibiting in the 2015 8 Miles of Ag-tiques. Nordmeyer came down from Browntown and set up his display in the machine shed behind the BP station on the highway in Orangeville. There were 9 different exhibits in the shed; some with toys or books or memorabilia for sale, but clearly, the exhibitors were all there to just relax and talk machinery.

Nordmeyer said everything on display at the BP was Massey-Harris manufactured.

"They started back in the 30s and they kept graduating up, making newer and better machines and today it is still Massey, but it's Massey Ferguson," he said. "Massey Harris went out in the early 70s, but they're very collectable."

Nordmeyer said he got started because his dad had Massey Harris machinery on the family farm while he was growing up.

"My dad had a 44 Special and we used it on the farm when I was a kid," he said. "Later, when he decided to sell out the farm I bought the 44 Special, restored it, painted it all up and I used to put it out in my yard for people to see. Eventually I bought another one and then another one and I think I've got 17 Masseys right now. It's a disease, but I love them all and it's a lot of fun."

He said there is a lot of truth to the club's slogan is. "Massey Harris collects the nicest people."

"You can ask a lot of people and they'll tell you right off that we're more of a family," Nordmeyer said. We don't argue. We don't fight. We don't get into bad discussions. We just set and have chit chat and a good time."

Ted Buisker and wife Sue were also exhibitors at the 8 Miles of Ag-tiques event. They specialize in rare Allis-Chalmers equipment and their collection runs the full gamut of tractor size and age.

"The big one up front was

produced from 1936 to 1942," Buisker said. "It's a Model A and came with three different sized engines. For its day, the A was a big tractor and they only built about twenty-five hundred of them because they were pretty expensive."

Expensive is a relative term and by today's standards the several thousands of dollars paid for a Model A is chicken feed.

"You could buy a Ford for \$400 you know, but those days are gone and you can spend about a hundred-fifty thousand to get a small tractor," Buisker said.

His love for Allis equipment

started when he was a kid.

"We used some Allis on the farm when I was growing up and I got interested in old tractors back in '73," Buisker said. "I went and joined the antique engine club down in Freeport and I went to a show down there to get an old Deere 36A, but decided instead to find myself an old Allis."

The rest is history. Buisker has 13 Allis-Chalmers tractors and said he intends to continue adding to his collection.

There is something about the allure of old iron. Those old tractors inspire awe. They're as powerful as they are purposeful and each of the exhibitors in the week-end long 8 Miles of Ag-tiques event was passionate about their choice of machinery. They all seemed to have begun their love for their chosen brand at an early age and good natured ribbing aside, all took time to admire the craftsmanship shown in each other's collections.

Long live those vintage machines and the men and women that run them.

Immunization clinic schedule for July 2015

LENA — Following is the clinic date for the month of July. Please call the Health Department at 815-777-0263 or toll free 1-877-777-0263 for an appointment.

All Immunizations Clinics are held at the Health Department.

Tuesday, July 21, 2015 from 1 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.

There is a charge of \$13.00 per clinic visit per client that covers RN review of immunization records, assessment of child's health prior to vaccination, education on individual vaccinations, answering of questions and official documentation of vaccines received. In addition a \$7 fee per vaccine is charged.

Please note: The Vaccines for Children (VFC) Program is provided through federal funding for children meeting the following eligibility requirements: enrollment in Med-

icaid or All Kids; are American Indian or Alaska Native; are "underinsured" (health insurance does NOT pay for vaccinations); or have NO health insurance. If unable to pay, clients will be charged on a sliding fee schedule after bringing verification of income. No client will be refused due to inability to pay.

If a parent is unable to accompany a child, the parent must complete a parental consent form for immunizations. The form can be found at the website: www.jodaviess.org. Print and complete the form and bring the form with the child. Parents may also stop at the Health Department in advance of the appointment and fill out the necessary forms. Previous immunization records must be presented to clinic personnel for verification or child will be rescheduled for a later date.

Bustos supports new effort to strengthen voting rights

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Congresswoman Cheri Bustos announced her support 06-29-2015 for a new effort to restore and advance voting protections for all Americans, the Voting Rights Advancement Act (VRAA).

"Your vote is your voice in our democratic system, but many Americans are still struggling to have their voices heard due to discriminatory voting laws," said Congresswoman Cheri Bustos. "I'm proud to support this new effort to ensure that every eligible American has the opportunity to speak up and participate in our democracy."

The Voting Rights Advancement Act would restore and strengthen key protections from the 1965 Voting Rights Act that were invalidated by the Supreme Court's 2013 *Shelby County v. Holder* decision. In the two years since the Supreme Court gutted these vital voting protections, states and localities throughout the country have passed sweeping laws that disproportionately suppress the voting rights of many. These laws have left voters without the protections they need to exercise their constitutional right to vote.

The bill was introduced last week by Senate Judiciary Committee Ranking Member Patrick Leahy (D-VT), Senator Dick Durbin (D-IL), and Senator Chris Coons (D-DE). Congressman John Lewis (GA-05) and Congresswoman Terri Sewell (AL-07) of the

Congressional Black Caucus, Congresswoman Linda Sánchez (CA-38), chairwoman of the Congressional Hispanic Caucus, and Congresswoman Judy Chu (CA-27), chairwoman of the Congressional Asian Pacific American Caucus, introduced the bill in the House.

Key provisions of the Voting Rights Advancement Act include:

A new geographic coverage formula that is based on current conditions. The bill establishes a "rolling" nationwide trigger that continuously moves so that only states that have a recent record of racial discrimination in voting would be covered.

Allows federal courts to bail in states for preclearance. Current law permits states or jurisdictions to be bailed in if an intentional violation can be shown. The new legislation offers more protection by allowing a court to bail in states or jurisdictions whose voting practices have discriminatory results.

Greater transparency in federal elections to ensure that voters are made aware of late-breaking changes in voting procedures. The additional insight will deter discrimination from occurring and protect voters from discrimination.

Revises the standard for preliminary injunctions for voting rights cases, allowing a court at the start of litigation to immediately halt a challenged voting practice until a final ruling. This provision recognizes

that when voting rights are at stake, stopping a discriminatory practice after the election has already concluded is too late to vindicate voters' rights.

Earlier this year, Bustos continued her ongoing efforts to

strengthen voter protections by backing the Automatic Voter Registration Act and the bipartisan Voting Rights Amendment Act. In March, Bustos commemorated the 50th Anniversary of the "Bloody

Sunday" Selma voting rights march along with a bipartisan group of over 90 other Members of Congress as part of the Faith & Politics Institute's 15th Congressional Civil Rights Pilgrimage to Alabama.

Bustos announces grant for NICAA

FREEMONT — Congresswoman Cheri Bustos (IL-17) announced July 2 a \$1,236,603 grant for Northwestern Illinois Community Action Agency in Freeport. The grant is awarded through the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and will be put toward Head Start projects.

"I'm pleased to announce this important investment in Freeport and East Dubuque youth and the larger community," said Congresswoman

Cheri Bustos. "Today's grant will help children and families in our region get a jumpstart on a quality education and allow our young people to develop the skills they need to excel and be healthy and productive members of our communities."

"We are thrilled to be provided with this funding," said Marcia Derrer, Executive Director Northwestern Illinois Community Action Agency. "This grant will allow us to

continue to serve nearly 200 children and families in our region by providing quality pre-school and partnering with families to set and attain

The grant funding will go toward Head Start programs in Freeport and East Dubuque. Bustos is a strong supporter of Head Start, a federal program that promotes the school readiness of children ages birth to five by enhancing their cognitive, social and emotional development.

The Fight for the Future of Illinois

Happy Independence Day! I hope you all enjoy the holiday festivities while keeping in mind the sacrifices for our freedom so many have made. Enjoy your BBQs and fireworks and parades, and never forget.

The rumbling of a state government shutdown is no more in question. July 1st came and went without a balanced budget in place. The stalled negotiations over the budget in Springfield empowered Democrat leadership to continue to muscle its veto-proof majority through politically charged show-trials and sham legislation votes with no compromise in sight.

The Governor recently stated, "This is a fight for the future of Illinois." Well, he's exactly right. We are in a fight to change the way government operates. Illinois' devious political culture has been threatened and the powers that be are starting to feel the pressure. Don't be fooled by their temporary solutions or their parade of what-ifs. The fact remains that we need a balanced budget that aims to spend less than what we take in. The rhetoric might seem redundant in recent columns, but it's the honest truth.

This week, we began session on Tuesday with another "Committee of the Whole" that discussed government operations. A panel of organizations around Illinois addressed the House with their concerns and possible financial problems

that could occur if a shutdown was permitted.

During the doomsday testimony of government operations, per usual as of late, House Speaker Mike Madigan held a press conference to alert the media that a short-termed budget solution would be voted on during session on Wednesday. "This is a one-month budget. This is a reasonable budget," Madigan said. This one-month budget would relieve some of the pressure legislators are experiencing from constituents back in their districts and once again give reason to create a political mail piece for anyone who would dare not vote with the Speaker.

In reality, this was the Democrat majorities attempt to take a piece-meal approach to the budget by backing a temporary budget to fund certain services at a level that is not sustainable over the course of the entire fiscal year.

Tuesday concluded with the understanding that we would resume the government operation discussions on Wednesday and vote on the Speaker's "one-month budget." We had till midnight on Tuesday to work on a solution before the state

would begin to shut down, but instead, we adjourned.

On Wednesday morning, we resumed the "Committee of the Whole" concerning government operations. We heard more stories and possible outcomes from the effects of a government shutdown. That afternoon, House Speaker Madigan called for the "one-month budget" to be voted on. To my surprise, the neediest services that gave hours of testimony during the "Committee of the Whole" were not funded in this bill.

All this bill would do is march the taxpayers of Illinois toward an unbalanced budget one month at a time. No matter how they slice it and dice it, the math just doesn't add up. It still does not fix the problem. I would guess if Democrats were serious about fixing the unbalanced budget they passed in May, that they would have already used their veto proof power to override the Governor's veto of their \$4 billion out of whack budget. However, that means they would have to use their super majority to pass a tax increase as well.

It's pretty clear where both sides stand at this point. One side wants to spend \$4 billion more than actual revenues, with a tax increase attached, while the other side wants structural reform to government and a balanced budget that is fiscally responsible to the taxpayers in Illinois. My colleagues and I

Kenneth Earl Clay

Kenneth Earl Clay, age 91, of Grand Rapids, MN, passed away Saturday, June 27, 2015 at Garden Court Chateau, Grand Rapids, MN.



Kenneth was born in 1924 near Stockton, IL, the son of Earl and Evelyn (Finkenbinder) Clay. He was raised on the family dairy farm near Stockton. He graduated from Stockton High School in 1942. Kenneth married Arvilla Byrum, his high school sweetheart, on March 10, 1946, at the Apple River Methodist Church. He was a dairy herdsman as a young adult until a 1951 farming accident necessitated a career change. He went to work at Atwood Manufacturing in Stockton, advancing to night supervisor at the time of his departure in 1968 when he and Arvilla purchased the Cut Foot Sioux Inn in Deer River, MN. Kenneth sold the resort in 1976 and retired to a North Sioux summer home on Big Cut Foot Sioux Lake, spending winters in Apache Junction, AZ. In 2006, he and Arvilla moved to Grand Rapids, where he resided until his residency at Garden Court Chateau in April 2015. Kenneth was a life-time member of the Plum River Masonic Lodge in Stockton, IL. He also enjoyed Big Band music, Nascar racing, and sports, and spending time with his grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

Preceding him in death were his parents; brother, Charles; sisters, Joan White Talkington and Earlene Logemann; son-in-law, Brian Breed.

next recipe will help you give your guests a good seafood dip without a lot of prep. You can use canned shrimp, but I like the frozen shrimp best. I like the spread on butter crackers better, but many others like the wheat crackers like Triscuits for this dip.

Seafood Dip

8 oz. cream cheese
½ C. salad shrimp, thawed and cut in two

½ C. imitation crab or lobster, cut into pieces

Mayonnaise
Shrimp Sauce

Slice the cream cheese in half and lay on the bottom of pie plate or raised edge dish. Mix the shrimp with some mayo to spread and then mix the crab with mayo until crab can be spread. Alternate a layer of shrimp and then crab and then top with other half of cream cheese. You can save some shrimp and crab for the top.

Pour the shrimp cocktail sauce over the cream cheese mixture

and refrigerate for at least 1 hour. Spread on a butter cracker or a wheat cracker.

I am hoping that the second crop of green beans actually gets to grow because I love fresh green beans. This salad uses fresh green beans, peas, sweet peppers, tomatoes, and onion. It is a veggie lovers dream salad. Enjoy this easy and tasty way to eat vegetables.

Veggie Lovers Salad

2 C. fresh green beans, cut into 1 inch pieces

2 C. fresh or frozen peas (thawed)

2 medium red or yellow sweet peppers, chopped finely

2 Roma tomatoes, chopped

½ C. finely chopped red onion

1 C. mayonnaise

¾ C. loosely packed Italian parsley

2 T. red wine vinegar

1 garlic clove, quartered

In a saucepan, bring 4 cups of water to a boil. Add green beans and cook uncovered for 2-3 minutes or just until crisp tender. Remove the beans and immediately drop into ice water. Drain the beans and pat dry. Place in a large bowl. Add the peas, chopped peppers, tomatoes, and onion.

In a food processor, place the mayo, parsley, vinegar and garlic and process until blended. Add to the vegetables and toss to coat. Refrigerate, covered, for at least 1 hour before

serving. Sprinkle any of the following or a combo on top: chopped cashews, chopped pecans, toasted sesame seeds or cooked and crumbled bacon.

This next beef recipe is for a hearty Swiss Steak meal. The paprika makes the steak brown beautifully. The addition of the mushrooms, onions, and carrots gives the traditional recipe the makings of a meal all on its own. My family always made mashed potatoes to go with Swiss Steak. It was a great way to tenderize a not-so-tender cut of meat. Enjoy this classic favorite anytime.

Swiss Steak Casserole

3 T. flour

1 ½ t. pepper

1 t. salt

1 t. paprika

1 lb. boneless round steak cut into ¾ inch cubes

2 T. oil

2 C. fresh mushrooms

1 C. frozen pearl onions

1 garlic clove, finely chopped

4 C. sliced carrots

1 can (14.5 oz.) stewed tomatoes, undrained

Preheat the oven to 350. In a medium bowl, mix the flour, pepper, salt and paprika. Add the beef and toss to coat. In a large skillet, heat one tablespoon of oil over medium heat. Add the beef, reserving the remaining flour mixture. Brown the beef on all sides and spoon into an ungreased 2½ qt. casserole dish.

In the same skillet heat the remaining oil and add the mushrooms, onions and garlic. Cook 2-3 minutes, stirring constantly, until browned. Spoon into the casserole. Add the carrots, tomatoes and reserved flour mixture and mix well.

Cover and bake 1 hour and 30 minutes to 1 hour and 45 minutes or until the beef and vegetables are tender.

This next cheesecake can be made into a "light" version by using 2% cottage cheese and reduced fat cream cheese. You can even substitute equal for the sugar. I love the fact that it is made in a small pan, so you can probably eat this dessert at one setting. Sometimes cheesecake doesn't do well as a leftover. I also think you can buy graham cracker crumbs and use the recipe on the box about adding butter and sugar for the base. Enjoy this neat little July dessert.

Red, White and Blue Cheesecake Bars

1 graham cracker crust (9

inch)

¾ C. cottage cheese

1 pkg. (8 oz.) cream cheese

1 C. sugar

1 t. grated lemon peel

2 T. lemon juice

1 t. vanilla extract

2 egg whites

1 egg

1/3 C. strawberry preserves

½ C. fresh blueberries

Preheat the oven to 375.

Line an 8-inch square baking pan with foil, letting the ends extend up the sides; coat foil with cooking spray. Break pie crust into fine crumbs into the prepared pan. Press the crumbs onto the bottom of the pan.

In a "mini" food processor, place the cottage cheese and process until smooth. Transfer to a bowl and add the cream cheese, sugar, lemon peel, lemon juice and vanilla, and beat until smooth. In a small bowl, lightly beat the egg whites and egg. Add to the cottage cheese mixture. Beat on low speed just until blended. Pour over the crust.

Drop the preserves by teaspoonfuls over the filling. Cut through with a knife to swirl. Sprinkle with blueberries. Bake 25-30 minutes or until the center of the cheesecake is almost set. Cool for 1 hour on a wire rack. Refrigerate 2 hours or until cold. Lifting with foil, remove the cheesecake from the pan. Cut into bars.

My church friend, Marilyn, had the best and easiest macaroon cookies at fellowship after church. She assured me they were really easy to make. There are only a few ingredients, and they really do melt in your mouth. Enjoy these easy and delicious cookies.

Marilyn's Angel Macaroons

1 pkg. (16 oz.) one-step angel food cake mix

½ C. water

1 to ½ t. almond extract

2 C. flaked coconut

Preheat the oven to 350. In a mixing bowl, beat the cake mix, water and extract on low speed for 30 seconds. Scrape the bowl sides and then beat on medium speed for 1 minute. Fold in the coconut and drop by rounded teaspoonfuls onto a parchment paper-lined baking sheet. Bake in the 350 oven 10-12 minutes or until set. Remove the paper with cookies to a wire rack to cool. This recipe makes 2 to 2½ dozen cookies.

Jo Daviess Conservation Foundation potluck and program with Randy Nyboer

GALENA — Natural Areas Surveyor Randy Nyboer will speak on "The Plants and Animals of the Driftless Area of Northwestern Illinois" at a potluck speaker event on Wednesday, July 8, at the Galena Territory Owners Club, 2000 Territory Drive, Galena. The potluck begins at 5:30, followed by the presentation at 7 p.m., for those wishing to attend just the talk. If coming for the meal, please bring a dish to pass and table service. As Coordinator of Field Surveys for the Illinois Natural History Survey, it is Randy Nyboer's job to discover "natural areas," or remnants of our landscape as it existed historically prior to European settlement of the area. As a young biologist in the 1970's, Nyboer participated in the first ever Illinois Natural Areas Inventory (INAI), also the first inventory of its kind in the nation. Surveyors found 1,100 sites across Illinois that still retained their original plants and animals. Now that survey is being updated.

Still have some strawberries? This easy recipe uses a sugar cookie mix as its base and is easy to make. It makes a ton of dessert squares, so it is great for a pot luck. It has the same taste as a dessert pizza, but it is made for strawberries.

Strawberries and Cream Squares

1 pouch (1 lb. 1.5 oz.) sugar cookie mix

½ C. butter, softened
1 egg

Filling:

1 C. white vanilla baking chips

1 pkg. (8 oz.) cream cheese, softened

Topping:

4 C. sliced fresh strawberries
½ C. sugar

2 T. cornstarch
1/3 C. water

10-12 drops of red food coloring (opt.)

Preheat the oven to 350. Spray the bottom only of a 15 x 10 inch pan (you can make thicker bars by using a 9 x 13 pan) with cooking spray.

In a large bowl, stir cookie mix, butter and egg until soft dough forms. Press evenly in the bottom of the pan. Bake 15-20 minutes or until light golden brown. Cool completely, at least 30 minutes.

In a small microwaveable bowl, microwave the baking chips uncovered on High 45-60 seconds or until the chips

are melted and can be stirred smooth. In a medium mixing bowl, beat the cream cheese with an electric mixer on medium speed until smooth. Stir in melted chips until blended. Spread mixture over the crust and refrigerate.

In a small bowl, crush 1 cup of the strawberries. In a 2-quart saucepan, mix the sugar and cornstarch. Stir in the crushed strawberries and 1/3 cup of water. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, until the mixture boils and thickens. Stir in the food coloring. Cool 10 minutes. Gently stir in the remaining 3 cups of strawberries. Spoon the topping over the filling. Refrigerate at least 1 hour or until set; serve within 4 hours. Store covered in the refrigerator.



"I dare you to go into the first church we come to and confess everything you did last night. I'll bet you \$100 you can't do it," he challenged. His friend accepted saying, "Sounds like easy money to me."

The first church they came to was Catholic. The man found the priest and began, "Father, forgive me for I have sinned." In graphic detail, he told of his escapades. The very perceptive priest, discerning the man's insincerity, replied, "My friend, I

give you a simple penance. Go to the front of the church, kneel before the altar, look up at the crucifix, stare into the Savior's suffering face, see the nails in His hands and feet, the crown of thorns on His head, and say, "Jesus, all this You suffered for me, and I couldn't care less."

The man came out of the confessional and demanded that his friend pay up. He replied, "First do your penance." The man went to the altar, looked up to the Christ on the crucifix and mockingly began, "Jesus all this You did for me and I ..." He couldn't finish. His heart was overwhelmed with his guilt. His head was flooded with things he had learned in Sunday School about Jesus' love and grace for him. He cleared his throat and tried again. "Lord Jesus, all this You did for me..." and he burst into tears. That man by the power of the Holy Spirit, became a new creation. Jesus Christ reclaimed him as a Child of God.

If we are in Christ, we are a new creation. So are we? We can find power in the cross and hope at the empty tomb of Jesus. Human hearts which have drifted away from God and become

hardened by sin—can be convicted and converted. At the cross, those who repent can find peace, those who are lost can be redeemed, and those burdened by their sin can find forgiveness.

We can do just about anything to the cross and empty tomb, except ignore them. We can't disregard the cross upon which our sins were crucified. We can't discount an empty grave that says, "Here death has been defeated." Why? Because the cross and the empty grave are God's power to create a new creature.

the escaped inmate. A search of the area was conducted and Kestner was located by an Illinois State Trooper at 9:52 a.m., on July 5, 2015, walking Illinois Route 82, 1/2 mile south of I-80. Kestner fled into a corn field, then exited the corn field and was taken into custody. Kestner was transported to the Henry County Jail.

Attorney General Madigan seeks order authorizing timely payments for critical services during budget impasse

CHICAGO — Attorney General Lisa Madigan announced she has filed an action in Cook County Circuit Court, seeking a court order clarifying that the State can continue to make legally authorized payments to fund critical government services in a timely manner.

Without a State budget in place, the Illinois Constitution and laws significantly limit the payments that the State can make. In preparation for the start of the new fiscal year, the Attorney General has been working with Comptroller Leslie Geissler Munger to determine what payments can continue without a State budget in place. Based on those preparations, this action seeks clear court approval for the Comptroller to make payments that do not legally require an appropriation by the Legislature, including payments authorized by specific state statutes, payments for services required under court consent decrees and payments to continue participating in federal programs. These payments help fund critical gov-

ernment services, such as medical care for children in foster care, residential placements for mentally disabled individuals, food assistance for low-income families, and the operation of the state hotline to report child abuse and neglect.

The action also asks the court to clarify the State's obligation to comply with the federal Fair Labor Standards Act by paying State employees the federal minimum wage until a budget is enacted and they can receive their full paychecks.





Experts say that excessive rain effects plant health

ELIZABETH — The northern Illinois region has experienced frequent rainfall in recent weeks. Although the abundance of precipitation addresses crucial crop and plant needs, this excessive amount of water also creates problems

for plants and crops.

"In the soil, water is the only place that plants can take up vital soil nutrients. Plants depend on water for this, but plants can reach a threshold where too much water can cause harm," states Grant McCarty, University of Illinois Extension Local Foods and Small Farms educator. "This threshold can result in wilting symptoms even after the soil has dried. Roots can be damaged and dislodged by water. At the same time, nutri-

ents can be removed from the soil and result in erosion problems overtime," explains McCarty.

Rainfall also leads to wet foliage. "Certain plant pathogens that cause disease move easily with water and can be passed among the plants that you are growing," said McCarty. "If you are working with wet conditions, you could be spreading disease."

Too much rainfall can also affect fruit quality. "If the soil remains waterlogged for a period of time, this can lead to faster root and fruit rot on strawberry crops. If these fluctuations of water continue in the season, tomatoes may also show blossom end rot damage."

When areas of your home or farm experience excessive rainfall, there are a number of things you can do to repair the situation soon afterward. "Immediately following a large rain storm, you should note if there are areas of poor soil drainage. These will appear as flooded areas. By knowing where these are, you might be able to add compost or organic matter after they have drained that can help with drainage later on," explains McCarty. "You also may want to avoid planting in this area in the future. For your plants, you should cover up the exposed roots so that the plant can hopefully regain its footing. You may also need to add a fertilizer or compost around the base of the plant if there has been excessive soil nutrient loss."


