Lena's own Leona and her little lamb

Leona Grebner just celebrated a birthday. She turned 98 years old and is still living on the farm where she has spent more than 70 years, loving life and finding beauty in the world around her every day. These days she has become known to many as Leona and Her Little Lamb.

Born in Freeport on Nov. 29, 1919 Grebner was the first of 10 children born to the Janicke family. Her father gave her the nickname of "The Peace Baby" commemorating the end of the First World War. Her nickname was a tag that she carried all her life.

As a child, Grebner's family was hard working, but often lived on the edge of poverty. As Grebner grew older she had to forego attending high school so she could help with the care of her siblings and take on work to help with the finances. She did cleaning, cooking, farm work and other tasks. Often, she earned as much as \$1.50 a week, but never bitter, Grebner has always maintained it may not sound like much, but they were happy to have it.

In 1946 Grebner and her husband purchased the 110 acre farm where

she still resides. Back then, the area immediately Northwest of Lena was reminiscent of the old frontier, and the Grebners acquired the property after a log cabin on the site that housed a small family was destroyed by fire. After purchasing the property, they built a new house.

Grebner recalls the lane being nothing but a cow path.

"We had to buy a horse to get up to the house," she said. "Behind the house was where the pigs (aka, Mortgage Makers) were kept. It was nothing but mud and my, how it stunk. When we first started we had cows and hogs, but then we bought our first sheep and I've loved sheep ever since."

For 31 years she was a Sunday School teacher at the Lena Baptist Church.

"I still get cards and letters from many of the children, now grown up, that I taught there," she said.

Leona's dining room table is covered from one end to the other with the birthday cards she had received for her 98th birthday. In another

Lena-Winslow Speech Team captures first place team ranking in Stockton tourney

Stockton High School was the site Dec. 2, for the inaugural Warhawk Pow Wow Speech Tournament, and it was also the first stop for the Le-Win/Orangeville Speech Team on its 2017-18 competition schedule.

"As is typical, we hit a couple of unexpected snags in getting everyone together, but we did well enough to get a first place team ranking," said Le-Win Head Coach Tom Fore. "The number of teams competing was smaller than most tournaments, but it was a good start. I give Stockton/Warren head coach Dan Stevens a lot of credit for creating this tournament. It was a good way for the area's teams to get back into competition. The alternative was for everyone to make the ninety-minute drive

to DeKalb and get swallowed up in what has turned into a massive tournament."

An interesting wrinkle in this tournament was the invitations sent to several local dignitaries to serve as "celebrity judges" in the various speaking categories' final rounds. These individuals were placed with other judges to decide the tournament champions in these categories. And, the student that these special judges selected as his or her favorite was given a special Judges Award.

Of the fourteen Judges Awards given,

the Le-Win/Orangeville team

claimed four of them: Justin Malone

(Radio Speaking), Abby Strominger

(Poetry Reading), Asa Lake (Humorous Interpretation), and John Jurkov-

ic (Original Comedy).

In any speech tournament, there are fourteen speaking categories, and usually the Le-Win/Orangeville team has entries in all fourteen. On Dec. 2, the team was missing one, Humorous Duet Acting. However, the squad's students were given awards in the other thirteen, which included three first-place prizes. The speaking

Broncos bounce-back runs out of time

The way the match was setting up last Monday night for the Orangeville Lady Broncos and the Pecatonica Lady Indians didn't appear to be anywhere near where Head Coach Steve Picavet thought it should be. The outcome didn't turn out anywhere near the way Lady Broncos' fans hoped it would be. Pecatonica held off an impressive second-half storm-back attempt by Orangeville to win 39-32. The Indians had the game won in the first quarter, it appeared.

Led by probable all-conference selection, Pecatonica junior Alyse Southard, the Lady Indians were faster than the Lady Broncos were right out of the gate. They handled the ball well and found inside scoring lanes. Pecatonica claimed a five-point, first quarter edge, before the first few minutes had expired. Orangeville stood strong, as the visitors pushed the lead to 14-9, with time winding down in the first.

The Lady Broncos were a much stronger team then what they showed in the opening minutes of their NUIC get-together with the visiting Lady Indians. Their weakened-early opening, indicated. Orangeville fought back a double-digit opening minutes disadvantage and showed itself to be the much stronger team, the later the game powered forward. Pecatonica was in front by a double-digit tally as the second began, 17-6.

Adjustments were made. The Lady Indians' offense wasn't getting the inside looks from senior Laura

Schulze. Southard had to get Pecatonica's attack-plan back on track. She accomplished that goal with her team's first basket with 3:15 remaining in the second. Orangeville held Pecatonica to four points in the second. The Lady Broncos climbed to ten-back at the break, 21-11.

Pecatonica responded in the third with hot shooting from Schulze. She guided her team to leads of 24-11 and eventually, 29-11. The 18-point deficit would shrink before the quarter closed though.

The Lady Broncos were down 17 points after three, 35-18. Junior Crystal Anderson started pushing her teammates after that. The guard bounced around, was bounced off and bounced back from a brief encounter with the gymnasium floor. Her exchanges with teammate, Emma Baker started leading to scoring chances and Orangeville didn't miss many.

The Lady Broncos outplayed Pecatonica substantially in the fourth quarter, not just by the point margin. They were stronger, faster and much more aggressive. They looked like a different team. The Lady Indians were held to four points. Orangeville put up nearly four times that amount. Time wound down, as the Lady Indians held on for the seven-point, 39-32 decision.

Orangeville faced Lena-Winslow on Monday night, Dec. 11, in NUIC play. The Lady Broncos stared down Fulton in the opening game of the Pearl City Holiday Tournament on Tuesday, Dec. 12.

The Lena-Winslow Lady Panthers are getting ready for some much needed holiday celebration. They, along with many other teams in the NUIC-West and neighboring North, are going to have a schedule filling up with tournament games. It's time for travel and coming together for the holidays. It also gives a team a good chance to explore its offense, with many games scheduled, over a shorter, relative period of time.

Lena-Winslow opened the Pearl City Holiday Classic with a nine-point win over the host Lady Wolves on Saturday, Dec. 9, 54-45. They doubled up on Pearl City in the opening minutes and then seemed to ease through the remaining 20+ minutes of actual tournament play. The Lady Panthers scored 21 points in the opener and that number alone would have still guaranteed the lead at the

half.

Pearl City put up ten in both the first and second and trailed at the break 36-20. Lena-Winslow got to explore additional options in the offense. They got to spend a little more time setting up plays and working the ball to the open player. With the perimeter in check, the inside opened from time to time. The Lady Panthers scored eight points in the period. Pearl City knocked down twelve. After three, Lena-Winslow remained in control and in front, 44-32.

The two teams exchanged baskets in the final minutes and both found some new looks at the rim. The squads combined for 23 in the period. Lena-Winslow captured the victory though, 54-45.

Game two in the Pearl City Holiday Invitational was a little more tricky for the Lady Panthers. They fell to NUIC-familiar River Ridge/Scales Mound, 39-33. It was a tough 26-point win, 76-50.





FROM LENA'S KITCHEN



The not so skinny cook

We have had our first snowfall. It does make everything really look pretty. It will help get us all in the Christmas spirit. This week's recipes could help you also. Enjoy an array of things you could use for a holiday feast.

This first recipe is for a great cheese ball. It is different because it uses sundried tomatoes. I like the ones that are in the oil rather than in the can. You can use walnuts or pecans for the nuts. Someone also suggested trying pistachio nuts for a really different taste.

Sundried Tomato Basil Cheese Ball

1 pkg. (8 oz.) cream cheese, softened
 ½ C. shredded mozzarella cheese
 ½ C. chopped sundried tomatoes (in oil)
 1 t. dried basil
 ½ t. garlic powder
 ¼ t. salt

2/3 C. chopped nuts

In a bowl, mix the cream cheese, mozzarella, sun dried tomatoes, and spices together. Chill mixture about 30-45 minutes until firm. Shape into a ball and roll in nuts. Serve with carrot sticks, sliced cucumbers or crunchy breadsticks.

I have a friend who loves black beans in anything. This recipe jazzes up the black beans with a little chipotle flavor, but it also has a great citrus flavor with the chipotle. These make a great side if you are going the non-traditional route for Christmas.

Zippy Black Beans

½ C. finely diced onion
 1 T. minced fresh garlic
 ½ t. ground coriander
 1 T. olive oil
 2 cans (15 oz. each) black beans and liquid
 2 T. fresh orange juice
 1 T. minced chipotle in adobo sauce
 1½ t. honey
 ¼ t. minced orange zest
 2 t. fresh lime juice
 Salt to taste

In a saucepan with ½ teaspoon of oil, cook the onion, garlic, and coriander over medium low heat, covered, until onion softens, about 5 minutes. Stir in beans, orange juice, chipotle, honey, and zest; simmer until thickened, about 10 minutes. Stir in lime juice and season with salt.

Guess what, I found still another wild rice casserole that is really tasty.

I like to try different recipes until I find my favorite. You can use portabella mushrooms if you wish instead of the button ones. It gives it just a little different taste. I mentioned last week that my go to wild rice is the Uncle Ben's Wild Rice. Don't use the quick cook for this recipe. The thyme and beef consommé also adds additional flavor.

Mushroom and Wild Rice Casserole

5 T. butter
 1 pkg. (8 oz.) sliced fresh mushrooms
 1 C. chopped yellow onion
 1 pkg. (8 oz.) long-grain and wild rice blend with seasoning
 2 T. chopped fresh thyme
 1 can cream of mushroom soup
 1 can beef consommé

Preheat oven to 350. Spray a 2-quart baking dish with cooking spray. In a large skillet, melt butter over medium heat. Add mushrooms and onion; cook, stirring occasionally, until just tender, about 5 minutes. Stir in rice and thyme; cook, stirring constantly, for 3 minutes. Remove from heat, and stir in soup and consommé until well combined. Spread mixture into prepared pan, and cover with foil. Bake until rice is tender and liquid has been absorbed, 45-60 minutes before serving.

Here is a great recipe that doesn't take long to make. If you want to use the wild rice recipe above as a side, just don't serve with rice. It is easy to make on the stove and a fast weeknight meal. It is also good enough to serve for any holiday meal.

Chicken with White Wine Sauce

1 t. plus 2 T. butter, divided
 ½ C. sliced almonds
 2 T. flour
 ¼ t. salt
 1/2 t. poultry seasoning
 ½ t. pepper
 4 boneless skinless chicken breast halves

½ C. white wine or chicken broth
 In a large skillet, melt 1 teaspoon butter over medium high heat; sauté sliced almonds until lightly brown. Remove from pan. In a shallow bowl, mix the flour and seasonings. Dip chicken in mixture to coat lightly. In the same pan, heat remaining butter over medium heat; cook the chicken, covered, until browned, 3-4 minutes per side.

Add the white wine and bring to a boil. Reduce heat simmer, covered, until a thermometer inserted in chick-

en reads 165, 4-6 minutes. Sprinkle with toasted almonds. Serve with white or brown rice.

Sometimes I like to jazz up pork chops. The cranberry pan sauce adds just the right flair for an elegant meal. You make this on the stove for a quick preparation. Serve it with the wild rice mushroom side and some candied or roasted carrots. You will have a great meal in just a little time.

Pork Chops with Cranberry Pan Sauce

6 boneless pork loin chops
 ¾ t. salt
 ¼ t. pepper
 2 t. cornstarch
 1 C. cranberry-apple juice
 2 t. honey
 ¾ C. dried cranberries

1 T. minced fresh tarragon
 1 T. minced fresh parsley
 3 C. hot cooked brown rice

Sprinkle pork chops with salt and pepper. In a large nonstick skillet coated with cooking spray, brown chops over medium heat, 3-5 minutes per side. Remove from pan.

In the same pan, mix cornstarch, juice and honey until smooth, stir in dried cranberries and herbs. Bring to a boil, stirring to loosen browned bits from pan; cook until thickened and bubbly, about 2 minutes. Add the chops. Reduce the heat; simmer, covered, until a thermometer inserted in pork reads 145, 4-5 minutes. Let stand 5 minutes before serving. Serve with rice.

This is a great creamy white chocolate fudge candy recipe. It is made with marshmallow cream. Remember to use evaporated milk and not sweetened condensed milk. Serve this on a candy tray with your favorite chocolate fudge, and it is really pretty!

White Chocolate Fudge

1½ t. plus ¾ C. butter, softened, divided
 3 C. sugar
 1/3 C. evaporated milk (1 can 5 oz.)
 1 pkg. (12 oz.) white baking chips
 1 jar (7 oz.) marshmallow crème
 1 t. vanilla

Line a 9 x 13 pan with foil, grease foil with 1½ t. butter

In a heavy saucepan, combine sugar, milk and remaining butter; bring to a rapid boil over medium heat, stirring constantly. Remove from heat; stir in baking chips and marshmallow cream until melted. Stir in vanilla. Immediately spread into prepared pan. Refrigerate until firm, 1-2 hours.

Using foil, lift fudge out of pan. Remove foil; cut fudge into 1 inch squares. Store between layers of waxed paper in an airtight container.

This candy recipe is a brittle made with cashews instead of peanuts. If you are a cashew lover, this recipe is a good one for you. Enjoy a different kind of candy brittle with the cashews.

Cashew Brittle

2 t. butter, divided
 1 C. sugar
 ½ C. light corn syrup
 1 to 1½ C. salted cashew halves
 1 t. baking soda
 1 t. vanilla
 Grease baking sheet with 1 tea-spoon butter.

In a microwave safe bowl, mix sugar and corn syrup, microwave to dissolve sugar; microwave 2 minutes longer. Stir in cashews and remaining butter; microwave on high for 40 seconds. Stir, continue microwaving in 20 second intervals until mixture turns a light amber color, about 1-2 minutes. The mixture will be very hot. Quickly stir in baking soda and vanilla until light and foamy.

Immediately pour onto prepared pan, spreading with a metal spatula, cool slightly. Refrigerate until set, 15-20 minutes. Break brittle into pieces. Store between layers of waxed paper in an airtight container.

I have a marbled brownie recipe that uses a brownie mix; it makes a 9 x 13 pan. I like this recipe because it is in an 8 x 8 pan, and is great for a platter of cookies. A friend made this and substituted one of the semi-sweet chocolate chip cups for white chocolate chips to use in the cream cheese layer. I also frost these with milk chocolate frosting (from a can) to make them even more decadent.

Chunky Cheesecake Brownies

1 pkg. (8 oz.) cream cheese, softened
 ¾ C. sugar
 3 eggs
 2 C. semisweet chocolate chips
 ¼ C. butter
 2/3 C. flour
 ½ t. baking powder
 ¼ t. salt
 1 t. vanilla

Preheat the oven to 350. Grease an 8-inch square baking pan. Beat together the cream cheese, ¼ C. sugar, and 1 egg with an electric mixer in a bowl until smooth. Stir in 2 C. chocolate chips

Bring 4 cups of water to a boil in a 2 quart saucepan. Turn off heat. In a heatproof mixing bowl set over the water, stir together the butter and remain cup of chocolate chips until melted and fully combined. Stir in remaining ½ C. sugar and 2 eggs, followed by the flour, baking powder, vanilla, and salt.

Pour half of the chocolate batter into the prepared pan; spread into an even layer. Spoon and gently spread the cream cheese mixture over the chocolate batter. Drop by spoonfuls



Throwback Thursday: Construction for Curtiss Hall

Construction for Curtiss Hall on the Iowa State campus took place from 1906-1909. It was originally named Agricultural Hall.

A plan for the building initially had it placed 100 feet to the west, but was moved due to concerns of having a building on central campus. Construction on the building ceased in 1907 because the original contractor went bankrupt. A bonding company picked up construction of the building soon after and finished it in 1909.

The building was not occupied until 1912 because accounts with a surety company were not balanced.

In 1947 the building was renamed after Dean Charles F. Curtiss.

Curtiss was born in 1863 in Nora, Illinois. He grew up 10 miles north of Iowa State College. He graduated from Iowa State College in 1887.

In 1891 he would join faculty, and would earn his M.S. in 1894.

Curtiss would help develop the first four-year curriculum which would be integrated at Iowa State in 1892. In 1896 he would become a professor for animal husbandry and

later became the head in 1897.

In 1902 he became the dean of the College of Agriculture.

Curtiss was a candidate for the Iowa State presidency two times during his time at Iowa State.
