## Alden-Hebron welcomes top seed Stockton

A great test for a possible post-season preview appeared for the Stockton Lady Blackhawks as they played as a guest in the annual Eastland Volleyball Invitational Tournament on Saturday, Oct. 13. They ran into the Sterling Newman Central Catholic Lady Comets and left in a one-one tie. It was a unique opportunity for those in attendance at a possible preview of an upcoming State Playoff game. The Lady Blackhawks open their pursuit of a trek to Normal on Tuesday, Oct. 23 at 5:30 p.m. at Alden-Hebron High School.

The IHSA Seeding Committee has already made their selections as to which teams are the best in the Illinois northwest. The two-seed was handed down to Stockton. They open the Class 1A State Volleyball Playoffs in Alden-Hebron as the top prospect to finish first. It would advance them to Polo and a shot at a Sectional Title. It's there they might run into Sterling Newman again.

The Sterling Newman Lady Comets have been issued the top notch in the 2018 bracketeers guide to the playoffs. They enter the final week of regular season play with a 22-6-1 mark overall. They are undefeated in the Three Rivers Conference and trail only 29-4 Orion in the overall picture. The number one seed was accorded, as a result of specific statistics. Sterling Newman will also host its own Class 1A first round tournament and then send its victor to Polo for a possible showdown with the Alden-Hebron Regional winner. That might be Stockton. This game won't end a tie.

Stockton got the two and it was a strong showing. Since August, the Lady Blackhawks have won at a nearly two-to-one clip. The numbers show they've been strong all season and hoist a 15-8-1 mark as a result. They earned an 8-3 record in head-to-head battles within the NUIC, but, with a week to play, still sit nearly 15 games behind NUIC-leading Durand. The Lady Bulldogs are one win away from 30. They've only lost twice.

Game play begins on Monday, Oct. 22. Six-seed Freeport Aquin faces seven-seed Orangeville. The survivor moves to the Tuesday night, Stockton post-season premiere. Oddly enough, based on scheduling, the Lady Blackhawks have had limited exposure to Aquin or Orangeville in 2018. They weren't scheduled to play this season. That will change on Tuesday. They'll see one of them.

The winner from the Tuesday night semi-final will face the winner from the late game, which will be the survivor of the second semi-final pitting four-seed Alden-Hebron against five-seed Pearl City. An upset of the home team by the Lady Wolves could put them into the path of Stockton once again. The fall season finale is at home for Stockton and features Pearl City this Thursday, Oct. 18.

The Lady Wolves open the final week sitting eight games behind Durand in the NUIC standings. They carry a double-digit win total but have slipped down the standings due to the loaded front end within the conference. They are one of nine teams that carry that distinction. However, there are four teams that have already won 20 or more games this season. Galeana and Lena-Winslow are both teams standing in pursuit of Durand as the final week plays through. Forreston captured win 20 a week ago.

Sterling Newman and Stockton could be on a collision course. The winner from the Monday, Oct. 29, Polo Sectional opener advances to the Wednesday final against whichever 20-win team or upset minded dark horse survives game play in Durand and Ashton Franklin Center.

There are many who feel that Durand, which hosts its own 1A Polo Sectional play-in, could be a major problem for a lot of teams soon. Stockton could be one of those teams. The more success the Lady Blackhawks find, the more challenging the battle, statistically, will be. If they win to Wednesday, they are going to probably have to deal with the Lady Bulldogs, or the team that pulled off the upset of the overall number one seed.

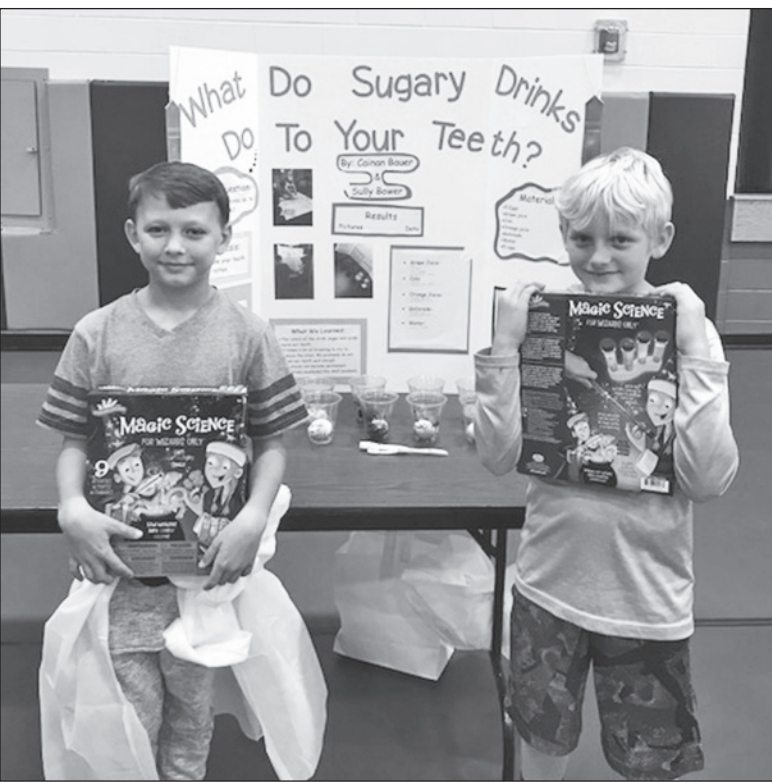

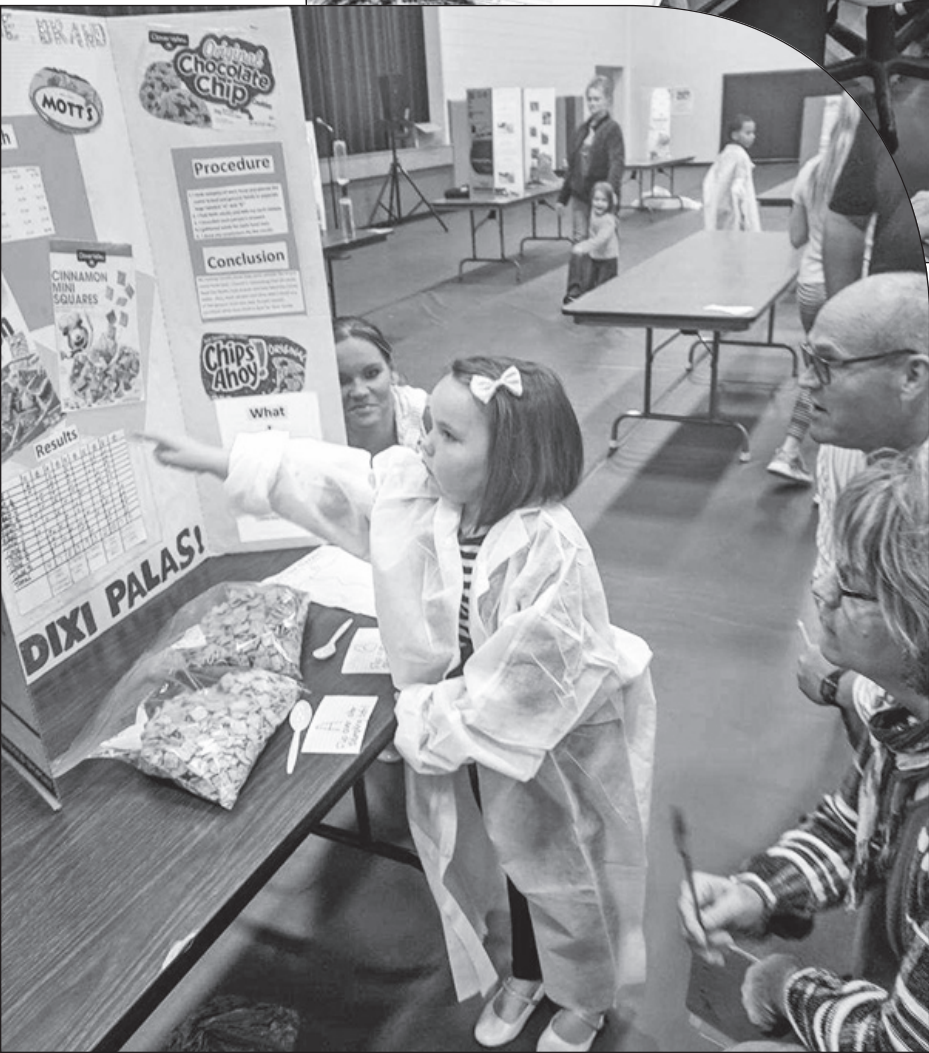

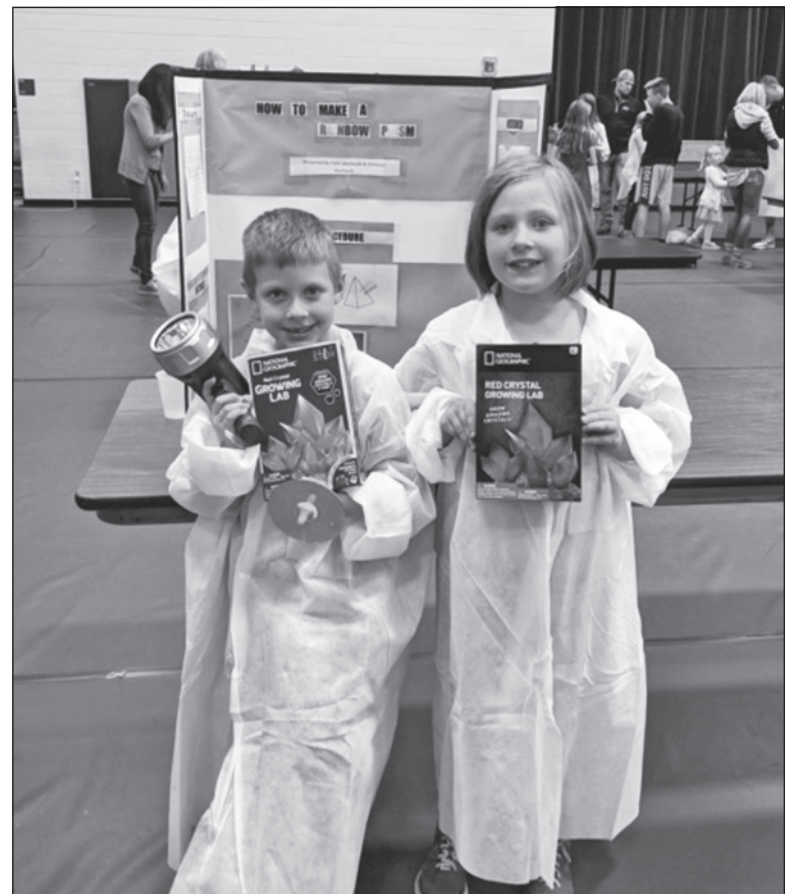

# AG Madigan calls on FCC to stop illegal robocalls and spoofing

Attorney General Lisa Madigan along with a bipartisan coalition of 33 attorneys general called on the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) to create new rules to allow telephone service providers to block more illegal robocalls flooding phones in Illinois and across the country.

In July 2017 Madigan and 29 attorneys general urged the FCC to give telephone service providers authority to block illegal robocalls, including calls from spoofed numbers. As a result, the FCC issued the 2017 Call Blocking Order last November. In comments submitted this week to the FCC, Madigan and the attorneys general express concern that scammers continue to circumvent the carriers' efforts to block unwanted robocalls. The attorneys general are urging the FCC to give providers additional authority to work together to detect and block more illegal spoofed robocalls, including "neighbor spoofing."

"As I continue to try and protect consumers from the nuisance of unwanted robocalls, scammers continue to develop ways to circumvent the technology and the law," Madigan said. "I urge the FCC to act quickly and encourage providers to develop and implement new detection and

blocking technology as soon as possible."

"Spoofing" is when a call appears to come from one phone number but is actually coming from a different number, making it difficult to identify the caller or trace the call. Increasingly, scammers are using a technique called "neighbor spoofing," so that calls - no matter where they originate - appear on a caller ID as a phone number with same local area code as the consumer.

In their comments, Madigan and the attorneys general wrote:

"Virtually anyone can send millions of illegal robocalls and frustrate law enforcement with just a computer, inexpensive software and an internet connection."

Despite the FCC's order, robocalls continue to be a consistent complaint by consumers nationwide. In 2017, the Federal Trade Commission received 4.5 million complaints regarding illegal robocalls, two and a half times more than it received in 2014. Illinois consumers filed nearly 300,000 complaints about robocalls in 2017.

In the formal comments, Madigan and the coalition expressed support for the 2017 Call Blocking Order, which gives phone service providers the ability to authenticate legitimate

calls and identify and block illegally spoofed calls. The service providers are developing new technology to detect and block illegal spoofed calls, even those coming from what are otherwise legitimate phone numbers. The comments also urge the providers to develop and implement this new technology as soon as possible

## Independent colleges key to improving Illinois higher education

Everywhere we turn these days, we are inundated with political ads with the right talking points: creating good jobs, reducing the out-migration of our population, improving the economic vitality of our communities throughout the state. We should challenge our elected leaders to also deliver concrete, realistic recommendations to make that a reality.

In the last 15 years, Illinois disinvested in higher education by \$1 billion. The results were devastating: higher tuition, students flocking away from campuses instead of to them, and some institutions left on fiscal life support.

Illinois hasn't conducted a comprehensive review and developed a road map for our state's higher education future for 50 years, since the last 1960s. A group of lawmakers

– the bi-partisan, bi-cameral, Higher Education Working Group – deserves credit for starting down this path and lead key initial steps this year, such as a renewed commitment to need-based MAP funding and the AIM High Scholarship program at public universities for students from middle-income families.

But there is more work to be done, by everyone in Springfield. And our independent colleges and universities should be a key part of the conversation. Our economic impact on our private campuses tops \$20 billion. Far more Illinois students stay to attend four-year private schools in state than they do in Indiana, Wisconsin and Iowa. We should build on that advantage by offering similar incentives, through targeted state funding, for students who attend independent colleges and universities. Rather than pit publics versus privates, we should level the playing field so all of our colleges can successfully turn

Minnesota, Mississippi, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, North Dakota, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Tennessee, Utah, Vermont, Virginia, Washington and Wisconsin, as well as the Hawaii Office of Consumer Protection.

around the out-migration and grow and thrive again.

When Illinois students know their best opportunity to succeed is simple – attend here, graduate here, stay here – we all win.

## Farm bill expiration fails young people nationwide

The farm bill is the primary method in which our government invests in rural communities across the nation – without it, our farmers would be uncertain and our communities without access to food and other crucial resources. Congress' failure to pass a new bill, or an extension of the existing legislation, has left young people in rural areas with anxiety for the future.

Expiration leaves our nation's beginning farmers and ranchers without access to resources they need to be successful in an aging profession. In 2017, the average age of a farmer was 58 years old. As these farmers hang up their boots, young people must be equipped to handle this transition.

Serious challenges like diminished access to land and capital, an absence of trusted networks, and limited knowledge of available resources can, and are, blocking their entry into the industry.

Before the farm bill expired – taking away funding and the USDA's authority to administer it – the Beginning Farmer and Rancher Development Program helped budding agriculturalists overcome these barriers. The Senate draft farm bill offered a new approach, the Farming Opportunities Training and Outreach Program, that would make a mandatory investment in the next generation. But, lawmakers failed to negotiate and pass a final 2018 farm bill in time.

A farm bill expiration is disheartening to young people across the U.S. because it sends a message that Congress failed to support them. Letting these programs expire shows young people that Congress has other priorities – none of which include the next generation of farmers.

The 2018 election season has seen its share of negative advertising and bitter words. There are many needs when it comes to the well-being of Illinois children. It is important that those issues stay front and center not only in the final month of the campaign season but following the election. These are issues we hope both Republicans and Democrats will work on in the next General Assembly.

As you listen to the comments of candidates for the Illinois House, Illinois Senate, and statewide offices, consider asking them the following:

Last year, Illinois approved a revision to the school funding formula to get additional dollars to those school districts most in need. While not in statute, proponents pledged to inject an additional \$3.5 billion during the next ten years into the educational system to reduce inequities in school funding. Yet, the General Assembly did not approve additional funding. Is the candidate committed to the increased funding and how does he or she plan

to provide it?

Ninety-eight percent of Illinois children have health insurance. Yet, having health insurance does not equate to access to medical care. In addition, the state's All-Kids Program, which includes Medicaid, covers 42% of infants, toddlers and preschoolers and 100% of children in foster care. Is the candidate committed to providing the necessary reimbursement rates, whether or not under managed care, to ensure children covered by Medicaid have access to health care?

During the last several years, the state of Illinois has increased funding for early childhood programs. Yet, there are still Illinois children who do not have access to a publicly-funded program. Is the candidate committed to expanding opportunities for such programs to all Illinois children?

# Changes to EPA RVP regulations heralded by ethanol industry

While stumping last week in Council Bluffs, IA, President Trump called again for easing the REID Vapor Pressure or RVP regulations restricting year-round sales of gasoline formulated with 15 percent ethanol (E15). The President's remarks are welcomed by grain and biofuel producers nationwide.

E15 is a low-cost, high-octane fuel that is EPA-approved as safe to use in 90 percent of all vehicles on the road today.

"It is a plus for the ethanol industry, farmers and consumers," said Adkins Energy General Manager Ray Baker. "For the ethanol industry it means the potential increase of 1.3 billion gallons of ethanol demand in the next few years. For farmers it means the potential increase of a half billion bushels of U.S. corn demand to supply the ethanol industry over the same time frame. And for consumers, they will have increased access to a lower priced fuel choice at the pump. Consumer choice has been limited because retailers were hesitant to make changes to their products with the summertime RVP restriction."

Over the past couple years, the number of gas stations selling E15 has grown from 400 sites to over 1,400 sites.

"There are many new retailers who have indicated they are ready to start

selling E15 but were waiting for this RVP rule to come into effect prior to starting the conversion," Baker said. "After the RVP announcement Casey's pledged to add E15 to another 500 locations across the U.S. We expect even more growth like this in the next couple years."

He said many retailers will now confidently make the change and consumers will have a choice at the pump.

"Right now, ethanol is about 75 cents cheaper than gasoline prices," Baker said. "If another five percent ethanol is blended in gasoline it could mean even more savings for the consumer compared to traditional 10 percent ethanol blends. E15 can typically save consumers another five cents per gallon or more over E10."

According to researchers from the University of Illinois Department of Agricultural and Consumer Economics increasing the use of ethanol to 10 percent in gasoline saved U.S. consumers \$7 billion between 2008 and 2016. Using a similar model—accounting for both the price difference between ethanol and gasoline blendstock and the price difference between ethanol and other octane additives, the switch from E10 to E15 could save U.S. drivers approximately \$9.5 billion per year.

The increased use of E15 should also have a positive effect on the price of corn.

"U.S. farmers are in the midst of harvesting another record crop which is creating a surplus of corn in the U.S.," said Baker. "As a result, corn prices have been moving lower. The new rule will help the U.S. use more of the corn crop domestically which should increase the price of corn and strengthen our economy over time."

Adkins Energy has been increasing production for several years in anticipation of the now imminent regulatory change and expect to continue incrementally increasing production in the future as ethanol demand increases.

"Many ethanol plants will increase production in response, but also reinvest into new emerging technologies in their plant," Baker said. "Both of these will mean improved economics and increased jobs in the future."

An upswing in the use of E15 is an environmental plus as well.

"Ethanol blended gasoline is proven to reduce emissions and is much cleaner than gasoline," Baker said. "Studies show ethanol reduces greenhouse gas emissions by 43 percent compared to gasoline. Ethanol is also one of the best octane sources available and when blended in gasoline it replaces aromatics which are typically used by refiners to increase octane and are known to contain carcinogens such as benzene and toluene."

The President's comments may also open the door to new Renewable

Fuel Standard (RFS) talks.

The RFS is a federal program that requires transportation fuel sold in the United States to contain a minimum volume of renewable fuels.

"Our industry has always been willing to have meaningful dialogue that would benefit all parties in the discussion," said Baker. "However, most discussions have been centered around oil companies attempting to decrease ethanol demand as a result of their suggested changes to the RFS. I think the President's actions show the importance of cleaner burning fuels and a strong agricultural industry. Ethanol production uses the starch in corn to produce alcohol, but also creates a high-quality feed from the remaining components of the corn kernel. Our farmers feed and fuel our nation. We will only engage in talks that promote more benefits to our country from ethanol, not less."

U.S. Representative Cheri Bustos (D-IL 17th District) has long been a strong supporter of changes to RVP rules and heralded the President's announcement with cautious optimism.

"While I'm pleased that the President announced he's going to allow year-round E15 sales, this is the third time he's done so," said Congresswoman Bustos. "I hope he does follow through because making this common-sense change would be a great thing for our corn growers and ethanol producers. Just the same, one of the biggest challenges facing our

agricultural economy is the ongoing trade war that our President tweeted us into. We need to take a much more strategic approach—both through trade and ethanol—toward expanding export markets, strengthening family farmers and growing our heartland economy."

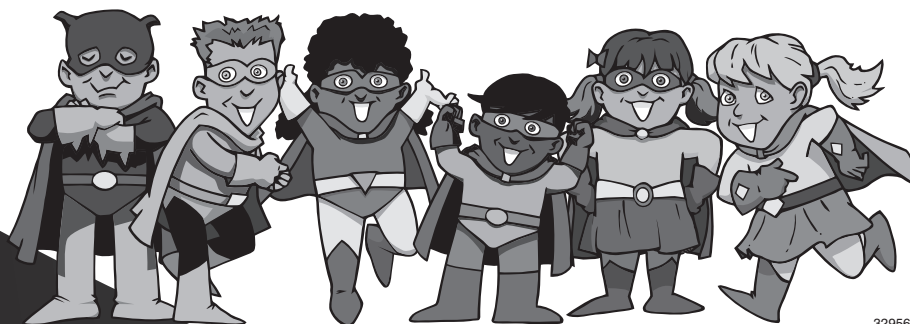

Voting assistance is also available inside the polling place from someone who accompanies the voter or from an election judge of each political party.

Early Voting by personal appearance in the County Clerk's Office is another option for all registered voters. Anyone may come and vote

in the Jo Daviess County Clerk's Office, 330 N. Bench St., Galena, between Thursday, Sept. 27, through Monday, Nov. 5, on weekdays from 8 a.m. until 4 p.m. and on Saturday, Nov. 3, from 9 a.m. until 12 noon.

Tuesday, Oct. 9, is the last day that new voter registrations or name/address changes can be taken and still allow the voter to vote at the polls. "Registrations can be taken at my office between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. Monday through Friday," Kaiser added, "and deputy registrars are located throughout the county. Registrations or changes can be made at most libraries or several other business locations."

State law does allow grace period registration and transfer of registration from Wednesday, Oct. 10, 2018 through Tuesday, Nov. 6, 2018. Grace period registration is conducted only in the County Clerk's Office and requires the individual to vote at the time of registration. Please be prepared to show two forms of identification, with at least one having your current address.

# From Lena's kitchen



The not so skinny cook

We finally had a freeze—good-night mosquitoes and bees; hopefully they are done for the year. I also will be glad to say goodbye to the pollen, and the allergy sufferers will have some relief. Although it is nice to have the cooler weather, it could have been gradual. Hopefully the fields will be drying out, and my farmer friends can get some harvesting done. This week we continue with fall ingredients for some good eats.

Since I seem to have an apple theme lately, this first recipe uses apples, cranberries and tart cherries. It is a take off on the traditional Waldorf Salad substituting the almonds for the walnuts. It is crunchy good, and the addition of the cranberries and cherries gives the apple salad a different taste.

## Cherry Waldorf Salad

- ¼ C. mayonnaise
- ¼ C. sour cream
- 2 T. honey
- 1/8 t. salt
- 2 large apples, cubed
- 1 T. lemon juice
- 1 celery ribs, chopped
- ½ C. dried cranberries
- ½ C. slivered almonds, toasted
- 1 C. fresh or frozen pitted tart cherries, thawed

Dressing: whisk together the mayo, sour cream, honey, and salt. In a large bowl, toss apples with lemon juice. Add celery, cranberries, and almonds; toss with dressing. Gently stir in cherries. Refrigerate salad, covered, 1 hour before serving. (To toast nuts; bake in a shallow pan in a 350 oven for 5-10 minutes.)

Continuing with the apple theme, this is a delicious acorn squash recipe. One of my former teaching buddies always put sausage in her acorn squash. So the addition of the apples rather than another vegetable is equally as good.

## Sausage and Apple

### Stuffed Acorn Squash

- 3 medium acorn squash, halved crosswise and seeded
- 2 T. olive oil, divided
- ¼ t. salt, divided
- ½ t. pepper, divided
- ½ lb. ground pork sausage
- ½ C. chopped onions
- 2 medium Honeycrisp apples, cored and diced
- 1 T. apple cider vinegar
- 1 C. panko breadcrumbs
- 1 t. poultry seasoning
- ¼ C. shredded sharp Cheddar cheese

Preheat the oven to 400. Brush cut sides of squash with 1 tablespoon of oil; sprinkle with salt and pepper. Place squash, cut side down, on a large rimmed baking sheet. Bake

until tender, about 40 minutes.

In a large saucepan, heat remaining oil over medium high heat. Add sausage and cook until browned, about 5 minutes. Remove sausage and let drain on a paper towels, reserving the drippings in the pan. Add the onions to the pan and cook for 5 minutes. Add the apples and vinegar; cook for 2 minutes. Stir in bread crumbs, poultry season and a dash of salt and pepper; cook for 1 minute. Stir in cheese and sausage. Divide mixture among squash halves. Bake until

golden brown and cheese is melted, about 15 to 20 minutes.

Turning away from the apple and fall theme in this week's column, the next recipe is for a taco casserole. It was given to me by a friend because it is simple to make and quick too. Enjoy this main dish Mexican entrée.

## Taco Casserole

- 2 C. cooked brown rice
- 1 can (15 oz.) refried beans
- 1 C. salsa
- 1 lb. ground beef

1 packet (1.25 oz.) taco season  
3 T. water

- 1½ C. shredded sharp cheddar cheese, divided
- 2/3 C. corn chips
- 1 can (2½ oz.) sliced black olives, drained

Sliced green onions, sliced avocados, diced tomatoes

Preheat the oven to 350. Spray an 8-inch baking pan with cooking spray. Layer 2 cups of the cooked brown rice on the bottom. In a microwave bowl, combine the refried

beans and salsa. Microwave until hot, about 2 minutes. In a large skillet, stir together the ground beef, packet of taco seasoning and water; cook beef through. Layer meat mixture over the beans. Sprinkle on ¾ cup of shredded cheddar. Scatter the corn chips over the cheese and top with rest of cheese. Sprinkle the black olives over the cheese. Bake 10 minutes until cheese is melted. Top with the chopped green onions.

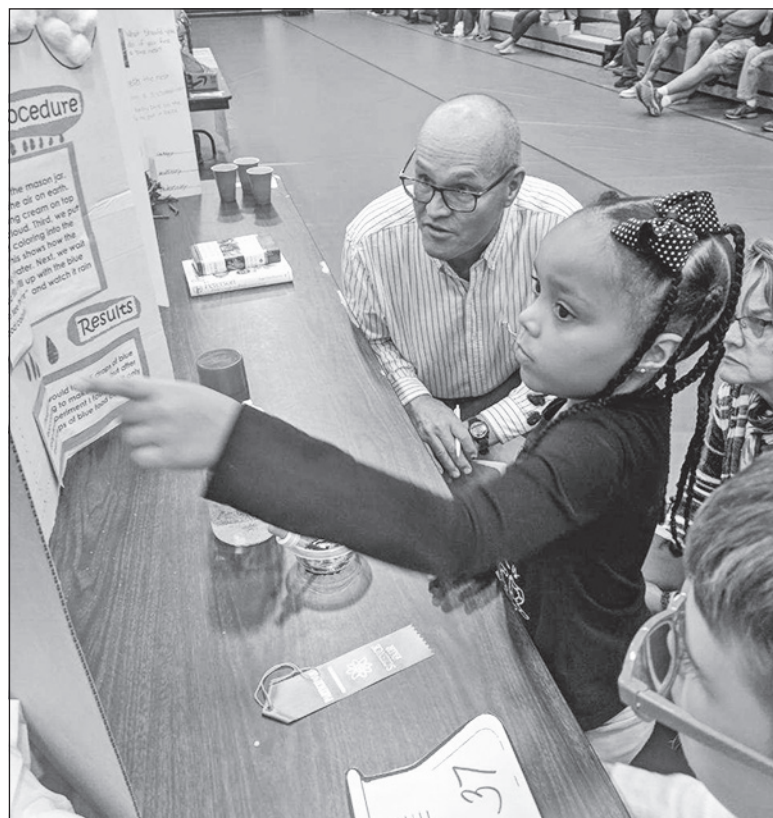

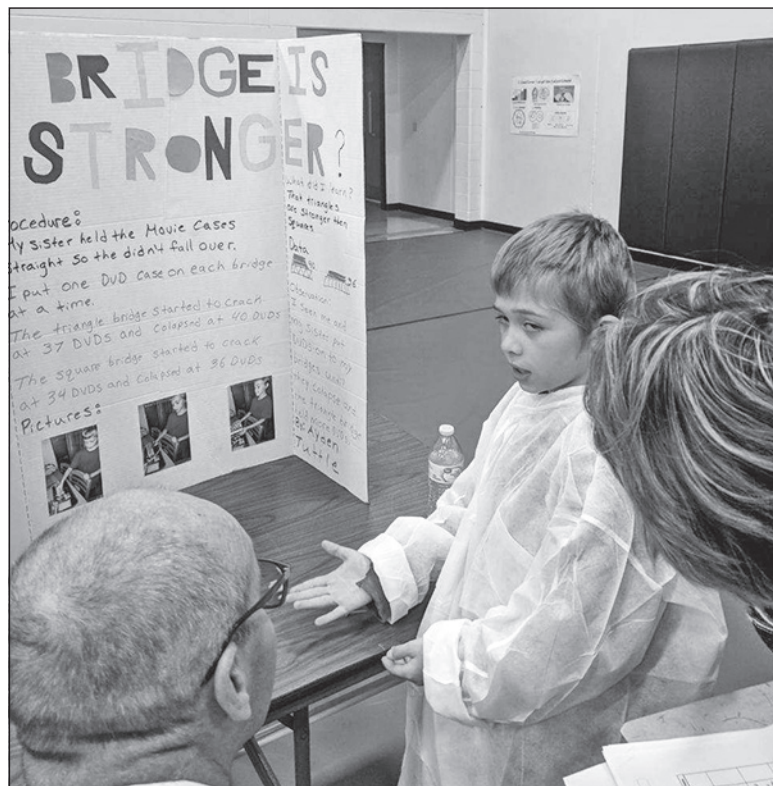

# Is it time for a soil test? Influenza education among youth in agriculture

It is that time of year again, when the combines are rolling and the bins are filling. We are not even done with harvest and yet we are already planning for the 2019 growing season. As fields are being cleared, producers will be considering many fall farm operations: herbicide burndown, additional tillage passes, manure applications, etc. With all of the action going on, it can be easy to forget that the fall is a great time to take a soil test. Soil testing in the fall will provide important information earlier, enabling more efficient decision making before the snow falls, or early in the spring.

Soil testing is not as simple as it once was. With advancements in soil microbial understanding and soil testing procedures, there are now more options than ever when it comes to soil testing. Various soil tests which are now available include: routine N-P-K, Haney, PLFA, Solvita, and Cornell. Each of these testing procedures provide useful information regarding soil chemical and biological properties, but finding the right combination of analyses can help keep your farm productive by optimizing inputs. In addition to the type of test to take, there is much to consider when taking soil tests: Where should I sample? How deep do I sample? How much soil do I need? How much will it cost? How often should I test? The answers to these questions will determine optimal sampling techniques and will vary significantly from field to field and in some cases, within the field.

Regardless of the challenges in soil testing, increasing the efficiency of current testing methods is a simple way to increase farm productivity while keeping costs down. Interested in learning more about various soil test types and testing strategies? University of Illinois Extension Commercial Agriculture Educator Phillip Alberti will be hosting a free program entitled Soil Testing for Crop Production. Topics include: advancements in soil health understanding, soil sampling strategies, soil testing types, and associated costs.

Zoonoses (also known as zoonotic diseases) are diseases that can be shared between animals and people. More than half of all infections that people get are spread by animals. One Health recognizes that the health of people is connected to the health of animals and the environment.

Since, influenza A H3N2 variant viruses (H3N2v) were first detected in people in 2011, outbreak investigations have identified illnesses, primarily in children, linked to close contact with pigs at agricultural fairs.

These illnesses show a need to educate youth about zoonotic diseases and how they can spread between animals and people.

To address this need, the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) established a partnership with the US Department of Agriculture (USDA) and the Council of State and Territorial Epidemiologists (CSTE) to promote One Health collaborations between federal and state public health and animal health authorities and state youth agriculture

groups through a program called the Influenza Education Among Youth in Agriculture.

The primary goals of this project are to help empower millions of youth in agricultural organizations like 4-H and FFA about ways to enjoy animals while reducing the risk of infection with zoonotic diseases and facilitate more effective and efficient response to important public health issues, such as outbreaks, by strengthening relationships among key stakeholders.

sliced avocado, and diced tomatoes.  
 The next two desserts again turn us to fall flavors. This apple spice cake with caramel is really a delicious way to use apples. The melding of the apple and caramel makes for a great taste. The cream cheese frosting really makes it extra special. I use Mrs. Butterworth's Butterscotch Caramel Ice cream topping. Smuckers has a good caramel topping too.

## Caramel Apple Spice Cake

- 1½ C. sugar
- ¼ C. canola oil
- ¼ C. unsweetened applesauce
- ¾ caramel sauce, plus more to serve
- 3 large eggs
- 3¾ C. flour
- 1 T. baking powder
- 1½ t. baking soda
- 1 t. cinnamon
- ½ t. salt
- 1½ C. buttermilk, room temperature
- 2 Gala apples, peeled, cored and finely chopped

## Cream Cheese Frosting

- 1½ pkgs. (8 oz.) of cream cheese, softened
- ¾ C. unsalted butter, softened
- 6 C. powdered sugar
- 1 t. vanilla

Preheat the oven to 350. Line a 9 x 13 pan with parchment paper and spray the parchment with cooking spray. In the bowl of a mixer fitted with the whisk attachment, beat the sugar and oil at medium speed until well combined. Beat in applesauce and caramel. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition.

In a large bowl, whisk the flour, baking powder, baking soda, cinnamon, and salt. With the mixer on low speed, gradually add the flour mixture alternately with the buttermilk, beginning and ending with the flour mixture, beating just until combined after each addition. Using a spatula, fold in the apples, scraping the bottom and sides of the bowl. Spread the batter in the prepared pan. Bake until cake springs back when lightly touched in the center and a wooden

pick inserted in the center comes out clean, about 55 minutes. Let cool on a wire rack.

**Frosting:** In a large bowl, beat the cream cheese and butter with a mixer at medium speed until smooth. Add powdered sugar. One cup at a time, beating well after each addition. Add vanilla and beat at a high speed for 1 minute.

Spread the cream cheese frosting onto the cake. Spoon caramel sauce over frosting and gently swirl into frosting using a spatula. Cover and refrigerate up to 3 days.

These maple cookies are good for fall or winter. The maple flavoring makes the short bread cookie special. The glaze reinforces the maple flavor. These cookies are easy to make and will disappear fast after you make them.

## Maple Cookies

- 1 C. unsalted butter, softened
- ¾ C. sugar
- ¾ C. packed brown sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 t. maple flavoring

- 2½ C. flour
- 1 t. baking soda
- 1 t. salt
- 2 C. white baking chips
- 1 C. chopped pecans
- 1/3 C. butter, cubed
- 1¾ C. powdered sugar
- 1/3 C. maple syrup
- ¼ t. maple flavoring

Preheat the oven to 350. In a large bowl, cream the butter and sugars until light and fluffy. Beat in eggs and maple flavoring. In another bowl, whisk the flour, baking soda, and salt; gradually beat the flour mixture into the creamed mixture. Stir in baking chips and pecans.

Drop cookie dough by rounded tablespoonfuls 2 inches apart onto ungreased baking sheets;. Bake for 10-12 minutes or until golden brown. Cool on pans 2 minutes. Remove to wire racks to cool completely.

**For glaze:** in a saucepan, melt the butter over medium heat. Remove from heat. Gradually beat in the powdered sugar, syrup and maple flavoring until smooth. Drizzle over

cookies; let glaze dry completely. Store between pieces of waxed paper in an airtight container.

# Lady Wildcats take upset approach into second season

River Ridge saw its designs on post-season consideration eliminated this past week as the result of a 54-14 loss to the 2018 Upstate Champion Milledgeville Missiles. The final game of the season will be played this Friday night and then attention can be turned towards the winter sports season and the basketball schedules waiting to be filled. Milledgeville was a tough battle

for a lot of teams this year in the NUIC Upstate. Statistically speaking, even in their non-conference matches, the Missiles still found ways to win and remain among the State of Illinois' elite 1A teams. They entered the week eight match ranked fourth in the State and trailed only three other undefeated teams. Every other 1A team in the State of Illinois has at least one loss. Quite a few more have two or more. A team with four losses can even still make

it into the playoffs. Squads that suffer their fifth losses, generally have to let things go. Now with a mark of 3-5, the Wildcats get set for their final action of the year.

A week earlier River Ridge did its best to upset the balance in the Upstate. They hurt the Polo Marcos with a 6-0 decision and put a lot of pressure on the post-season hopeful for its season-closing, Friday night match. They have to face undefeated NUIC-Northwest Champion Pearl

City-Eastland to close their season. Pearl City-Eastland looks to have its own focus set on entering post-season play as the overall number one seed.

The Wildcats have played their part on many nights in helping to mold the current Upstate standing. They've had to deal with a Stockton Blackhawks program that barely slipped by, by eight points, 22-14 mid-season. They faced down Freeport Aquin and dealt with Northwest visitor Galena. They toppled neighbor Warren as one of the many highlights of the season.

The final game of the season will be played away from home and when the Wildcats return, it will be time to head inside to the gym and prepare for Thanksgiving tip-off classics and the games waiting.

With the final week of games lining up across the State of Illinois for all high school varsity football programs, the NUIC-Upstate is under the control of Friday night's victor Milledgeville. They hold a lead over Stockton and Orangeville and sit three losses ahead of fourth-place position-holder Freeport Aquin. River Ridge sits in fifth place followed by Polo, Ashton-Franklin Center and Warren.

The Lady Wildcats open their second season this Tuesday. The 1A Girls' Volleyball State Championship Tournament sets up in Durand with a 6:30 set and eight-seed River Ridge faces three-seed East Dubuque. They'll get a preliminary look at the Lady Warriors this

Thursday night as the regular season comes to a close with an invitation to play being answered upon by East Dubuque.

Any thoughts of advancing through the early rounds of the 1A Regional rely on how prepared the Lady Wildcats are for the three-seed. They have not been unbeatable. They've lost eight times and have only won six more than they have given back all year. A good showing against East Dubuque in the fall finale could carry an extra bonus of even more readiness in place for upset-minded River Ridge.

A win over the Lady Warriors in the Durand 1A Regional Semi-Final puts the Lady Wildcats on a collision course with the State-ranked and NUIC-leading Durand. The Lady Bulldogs open the week in pursuit of win number 30. The Durand Regional Champion travels to Polo for the Girls' Volleyball Class 1A Sectional Championship. Only eight teams will remain standing after all Sectional Champions are crowned.

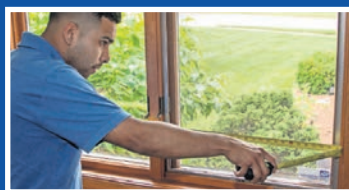

# Certified Food Protection Manager Course offered in Freeport

The University of Illinois Extension will offer the Illinois Certified Food Protection Manager Course, formally known as the Food Service Sanitation Manager Course (FSSMC). This two-part course will meet the 8-hour coursework and examination required by the State of

Illinois for both the initial CFPM, and the recertification. Effective Jan. 1, 2018, the Illinois Food Service Sanitation Manager Certification (FSSMC) was eliminated. However, the Illinois Department of Public Health's Food Service Sanitation Code still requires

food establishments to be under the operational supervision of a certified food service sanitation manager during hours of operation. Now food establishments must have an American National Standards Institute (ANSI) accredited Certified Food Protection Manager (CFPM) certification. This requirement helps to ensure the safety of consumers when eating away from home. Those receiving this certification have specialized training, by an ANSI approved instructor, regarding the safe handling, preparation and storage of food to help prevent foodborne related illnesses. The certificate is valid for five years from the exam date and then is repeated once a certificate expires. One of the positive aspects of this change comes in the form of students no

longer having to apply for the additional Illinois FSSMC certificate, which will save them money. During the two-day Certified Food Protection Manager Course, participants will gain knowledge about food safety and contamination, employee health and hygiene, safe food handling practices, cleaning and sanitizing, and HACCP. The Certified Food Protection Manager Course will take place on Dec. 4, 9 a.m. - 3 p.m. and Dec. 7, 9 a.m. - 2:30 p.m., at the Stephenson County Farm Bureau, 210 W Spring Street, Freeport. Participants should bring a valid photo ID and arrive 15 minutes early to register, as class will begin promptly at 9 a.m. Participants must attend the full training to be eligible to take the exam. There is a \$100 fee for the Cer-

tified Food Protection Manager Course. This fee is for the purchase of the book, educational materials, examination, and lunch. Space is limited and pre-registration is required. # Silent Fall now available

Copies of "Silent Fall", Mr. Ingram's latest book are now available to purchase. This book explains how Mr. Ingram believes that the cause of Colony Collapse Disorder (CCD) in honeybees is caused by Roundup and other agricultural sprays that have been sprayed around his community. In fact the book is dedicated to all of the beekeepers who have lost their bees and colonies to our agricultural sprays and have received no compensation from the farmers or the chemical companies or the government. The cost of the book from ENF is \$10 plus \$4 shipping and handling.

The book also documents how these sprays have for the past 35 years killed most of the birds that were living in this area of the country. It explains how many birds used to be living in this area as documented by Mr. Ingram's banding birds as a Master Bird Bander for over 50 years, and how now there are either none or very few left, with almost no birds seen migrating south this fall.

Over 55 years ago Rachael Carson in her book Silent Spring wrote about a hypothetical spring with no birds. Mr. Ingram is writing about a real silent fall with no birds present to sing or migrate that has been and is being caused by these agricultural sprays.

As a kickoff for this book Mr. Ingram will host a book signing on Saturday afternoon, Oct. 20, at the Burpee Museum in Rockford, IL when ENF sponsors two programs of Live Raptors at 1 and 3 p.m. The public is invited to attend.

# Wolves win Northwest! Declared Champion!

Pearl City-Eastland is the best in the Northwest. The State of Illinois is filled with strong 1A and 2A programs, but there are few individual programs that can work through strength with a suffocating style of play. The Wildcats are champions of the NUIC-Northwest. They captured that honor courtesy of a 21-10 win over the Dakota Indians on Friday, Oct. 12. The victory shot their season mark to 8-0 and guaranteed they would be the champion in 2018. If things change, they'll still capture the title.

A loss to Polo this Friday night at home, paired with a Lena-Winslow win over Dakota means the Wildcats will share the honors with the team they slipped past at the midway point of the season. On Sept. 21, the Wildcats topped the defending 1A State Champion Panthers 20-14, in Lena. Now that Pearl City-Eastland hasn't taken down the Dakota Indians, they know they don't have to worry about anything else this regular season. They won the conference crown. Focus will be shifted to the 2A State Football Playoffs, which begin next Friday

night.

The Wildcats are going to be home for game one of the second season and with a win, paired with a play-out of the bracket-system, they will be home again in November. At the start of the week eight games, the Pearl City-Eastland Wildcats were ranked number two in the State of Illinois. They are going to be a number one seed, possibly of the northern branch of the 2A Tournament, with a discovery of ways to find a win over the Polo Marcos.

Polo isn't going to be a pushover. They have a lot at stake. They know they will be playing in the post-season if they knock-out the 2018 conference champion. They look to be in anyway, thanks to their 42-18 win over Ashton-Franklin Center in the week eight game. The victory pushed their mark to the qualifying fifth-win range. If they lose to Pearl City-Eastland, they know they are still going to get to play in week ten, even if it's with a 5-4 mark.

However, the Marcos also know that they have a chance to get a home game in the opening round with a win. Only a handful of undefeated teams entered week eight, across the State of Illinois in the 1A realm. Programs from Argen-

ta-Oreana, Princeville, Milledgeville and Ottawa Marquette registered that honor.

Many teams that opened week eight with only one loss, ranked through position 17 on the list of the State's 32 best, lost. They entered week nine with a 6-2 mark. A lot of those programs now face the prospect of suffering back to back losses to close the season; since there's a good chance they are going to be facing another 6-2 or 5-3 program in their own regular season closer.

That reality will push them farther down the bracket and will have the effect of raising Polo up the rankings, if a regular-season closing win over a previously-undefeated conference champion occurs. The Marcos started the week holding a post-season securing position 29 on the bracket. They won in week eight and that means, they are probably already pushing into the top 20, if not beyond it.

Winning over Polo secures the Wildcats top-tier honors in the 2A Tournament. They could enter the second-season ranked number one in the State and be favored to be one of the two teams awaiting transfer tickets to DeKalb for the IHSA State Football

Title Game to help introduce Thanksgiving and the winter holiday sports and holiday season.

This Friday night the regular season

ends at home for Pearl City-Eastland. Next Friday night the second season begins and Wildcats faithful now they will be home when it all kicks off.
