Volunteer Visitors of Northwestern Illinois hosts Stockton open house event

Hospice volunteers provide different levels of support, talent and ability to the patients and families they serve. Some volunteers work directly with patient care, providing much-needed respite breaks to family members, running errands while lending emotional support and companionship. Other hospice volunteers assist with fundraising efforts, special projects and clerical work that supports clinical services and patient care.

Volunteer Visitors of Northwestern Illinois is one such organization and while celebrating an open house staged by members of the Stockton Chamber of Commerce, guest speakers provided information about the organization and its goals for the future.

"We're here today for a ribbon cutting to let people know that we've changed our name," said Volunteer Visitors Board President Leslie Niemann. "Changing our name by one little word affords us the ability to expand our services to more people in the community and to include Carroll and Stephenson Counties in our service area."

The organization was formerly known as Volunteer Hospice of Northwestern Illinois but is now, Volunteer Visitors of Northwestern Illinois.

"Folks don't have to be terminally ill to receive our services," Nieman said. "That means if you have an accident and you're homebound we can come and help you. Volunteer visitors will come out to your house read to you, play cards with you, or just be with you so you are not alone in your home."

Volunteer Visitors Executive Director Joanne Robinson said the visitors can also give a caregiver some respite time.

"Maybe a care recipient sleeps most the time, but through our visitors services the caregiver will always

know that someone is there," she said. Volunteer Visitors of Northwest Illinois also offers a lending program that provides medical and palliative care equipment, and the organization maintains a bereavement program.

Volunteer Visitors is actively recruiting volunteers.

"We talk to people and hopefully they'll talk to people," said Robinson. "We put ads in the newspapers to say we have training classes. We put posters out. And, we need volunteers for more than patient care. We also need volunteers for office work and for our fundraising efforts."

The Volunteer Visitors of Northwest Illinois current focus is expansion.

"We will be serving a three county area and we want to work more with the nursing and assisted living homes in the area," Robinson said. "There are churches and organizations that are doing some of the same things we're doing, and if we can work together we can serve more people. Serving more people is really our biggest goal."

She said there are no fees or charges for the Volunteer Visitor services as the organization is funded by very generous people in the community, by fundraiser projects, businesses that donate to support their efforts, and a yearly appeal.

"We are very grateful for all the volunteers that we do have," said Robinson. "If we didn't have a volunteer base we wouldn't be able to do this."

Again, all Volunteer Visitor services are without fee and projects including the Bereavement Program and the Lending Program are funded by donations and fundraising projects.

Stockton Chamber of Commerce President Marci Schubert acknowledged the Chamber's participation in the event saying, "It's always important to recognize businesses especially volunteer businesses for their service to our community."

She said Volunteer Visitors is a notable organization because it reinforces itself continuously.

"A lot of the Volunteer Visitors

board members are also board members at the Chamber and that says a lot about the support this community offers," said Schubert. "Volunteer

Visitors do a lot both in and outside of our immediate community and the organization provides many valuable services."

Stockton falls to Dakota in round one upset

The seven-seed Stockton Blackhawks hosted the 10-seed Dakota Indians for the opening round of the playoffs. Despite being the higher seed, Stockton fell to an upset by the Indians. It was Dakota's first ever playoff victory over the Blackhawks.

After driving the ball down to the Indian's one yard line, the Dakota defense managed to halt the Blackhawks for a turnover on downs.

It took just six plays for the Indian's

to drive the length of the field, as a touchdown and a failed two point conversion gave Dakota a six point lead.

Stockton surrendered a touchdown run, followed by a touchdown pass to Carter Drake, putting the Blackhawks in a hole down 20-0 late in the first half.

Dakota's Trey Engelbrecht opened things up in the third with a touchdown run, putting the Indians up 27-0. A flashy punt return from Engelbrecht on led for another touchdown run on the next drive as Dakota opened up a

34 point lead.

A Stockton touchdown pass late in the third would be the Blackhawks only score of the day, as a two point conversion pushed the score to 34-8.

Trey Engelbrecht had a huge day as he found his way into the end zone once again with a 57-yard touchdown run, giving Dakota a 41-8 lead.

Yet another Dakota score led to a running clock late in the fourth, as they eventually ran out the clock, completing the upset over the Stockton Blackhawks.

FROM LENA'S KITCHEN



The not so skinny cook

We are getting ready to celebrate the first of what I call the last holidays of 2018—Halloween. Kids are getting excited about what they are going to be, and adults are buying candy for the treaters. I finally got the candy; hopefully the rain they are calling for will not be coming down. I love to see their costumes without a raincoat. I look forward to this first of the last holidays. This week there are several interesting recipes. Some you could save for Thanksgiving.

The first recipe is for an interesting green salad which features celery. You use sliced celery and the celery leaves. The dressing is a creamy one. I like celery, so this salad appeals to me. I suppose you could substitute another green for the endive if you don't have any or can't get it.

Celery and Greens Salad

Dressing:

- 1 C. crumbled blue cheese
- ½ C. sour cream
- ¼ C. mayonnaise
- ¼ C. buttermilk
- 1 T. white wine vinegar
- 1 t. Worcestershire sauce
- Salt and pepper to taste

Salad

- 2½ C. bias sliced celery
- 2½ C. thinly sliced endive
- 1 C. loosely packed celery leaves
- ½ C. chopped pecans or walnuts, toasted
- ¼ C. thinly sliced red onion

Dressing: pulse the blue cheese, sour cream, mayo, buttermilk, vinegar, and Worcestershire in a mini food processor until a little chunky; season with salt and pepper.

Salad: Toss celery, endive, celery leaves, nuts, and onions with desired amount of dressing.

This interesting TexMex recipe pairs a barbeque sandwich with garlic toast. It is an interesting combination—sort of like a Mexican and Italian blend. It is an easy supper recipe for the fall.

Italian Joes on Texas Toast

- 1 lb. ground beef
- 1 small green pepper, chopped
- 1 medium onion, finely chopped
- 3 garlic cloves, minced
- ½ C. beef broth
- 1 can (14 ½ oz.) diced tomatoes
- ¼ C. tomato past
- ¼ t. salt
- 1/8 t. pepper
- 1 pkg. (11 ¼ oz.) frozen garlic Texas toast

8 slices mozzarella cheese
Preheat the oven to 425. In a skillet, cook and crumble beef with green pepper, onion, and garlic over medium-high heat until no longer pink; drain. Add broth. Bring to a boil and reduce beef by half, about 2 minutes. Stir in tomatoes, tomato paste, salt, pepper and return to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer until the mixture is thickened, stirring occasionally.

Place Texas toast on a foil-lined baking sheet; bake until lightly browned, 8-10 minutes. Top with beef mixture, then cheese and bake until cheese is melted.

I love the spinach artichoke appetizer, so when this combo was featured with chicken I figured it to be a good tasting way to make chicken breasts. It has a nice sauce made with the extra spinach and artichoke mixture.

Spinach Artichoke Stuffed Chicken

- 4 boneless skinless chicken breasts
- 1 T. chopped fresh thyme
- ¼ t. salt
- ½ t. paprika
- ½ t. ground black pepper, divided
- 1 can (14 oz.) large artichoke hearts, drained and chopped
- 1 pkg. (8 oz.) cream cheese, softened

1 C. frozen spinach, thawed and squeezed dry
½ C. shredded mozzarella cheese
¼ C. finely grated Parmesan cheese

- 1 garlic, clove, minced
- 2 T. olive oil
- 1 C. whole milk

Preheat the oven to 375. Place chicken breasts on a cutting board. Cut a horizontal opening three fourths of the way into one side of each chicken breast to form a deep pocket. Sprinkle chicken with thyme, ½ t. salt, paprika and ¼ t. pepper.

In a medium bowl, beat artichoke hearts, cream cheese, spinach, mozzarella, Parmesan, garlic and remaining

salt and pepper with a mixer at medium speed until well combined. Reserve half of spinach artichoke mixture. Stuff remaining mixture into each pocket, securing with wooden picks.

In a large ovenproof saucepan, heat oil over medium-high heat. Add the chicken and cook until browned, about 8 minutes. Turn chicken and carefully transfer the pan to the oven. Bake until a meat thermometer inserted in the thickest portion registers 165, about 10 minutes. Remove chicken from pan and keep warm.

Add milk to pan and bring to a simmer over medium heat. Stir in reserved spinach artichoke mixture until combined. Return chicken to pan until ready to serve.

These muffins have an extra treat in them. Pumpkin is great this time of year, and instead of pumpkin bread, this use of pumpkin in muffins is a great treat. You can save this recipe for Thanksgiving.

Pumpkin Surprise Muffins

- 2 C. flour
 - 1 T. baking powder
 - 1 t. cinnamon
 - ¼ t. salt
 - ¼ t. ginger
 - ¼ t. nutmeg
 - ½ C. sugar plus 3 T. divided
 - 2 eggs
 - 1 C. canned pumpkin
 - ½ C. sour cream
 - 6 T. butter, melted
 - 7 T. apricot preserves, divided
 - 4 oz. cream cheese, divided into 14 portions
 - ¼ C. sliced almonds
- Preheat the oven to 400. Whisk together first six ingredients and ½

cup sugar. In another bowl, whisk together the eggs, pumpkin, sour cream, butter and 3 tablespoons of preserves. Stir into flour mixture just until moistened.

Fill paper lined muffin cups half full with batter. Add a portion of cream cheese and ¾ t. preserves to each; cover with remaining batter. Sprinkle with almonds and rest of sugar.

Bake until top springs bake when touched, 20-25 minutes. Refrigerate any leftovers.

Berger cookies are well known on the East Coast. A German immigrant, Henry Berger, came to Baltimore, Maryland in the 1800's. He opened a bakery that would produce these famous cookies. The Berger Cookie is still available today. If you want an original, you can order one (or more) online. Enjoy these deliciously sweet and decadent cookies.

Some people would like them with coffee; I am a milk girl myself!

Berger Cookies

- 1 C. unsalted butter, room temperature
- 1 T. baking powder
- 1 ½ t. salt
- 2 t. vanilla
- 1 ½ C. sugar
- 3 large eggs at room temperature
- 4½ C. flour
- 1 C. sour cream

Icing:

- 4 T. unsalted butter
- 3½ C. semisweet chocolate chips
- 4 oz. unsweetened chocolate, chopped
- 2 T. light corn syrup
- 1½ C. sour cream

Preheat the oven to 400. Beat butter, baking powder, salt and va-

Influenza ("flu") isn't anything to mess around with - it can be serious or even deadly for elderly people, newborn babies, and people who have certain chronic illnesses.

Help your body fight off the flu this year by getting a flu shot at one of FHN's flu shot clinics, open to the public at convenient locations across northwest Illinois.

If you are an adult under 65 years of age, you will get a quadrivalent vaccine for \$28.

If you're 65 or over, you will receive a high-dose version of the vaccine (\$62). There will be no out-of-pocket expense if you are covered by Medicare Part B (please present Medicare card) or a Medicare HMO accepted by FHN (there's a list available at each location; covered persons MUST present the Medicare HMO card instead of the Medicare card for the billing process).

All immunizations not covered by Medicare or a Medicare HMO must be paid for by cash or check payable to FHN. The prices shown here are only available at these flu shot clinics; other rates may apply in FHN offices. No other insurance coverage can be accepted at these flu shot clinics, and per government regulations, no Medicaid cards can be accepted at these locations.

Because of federal guidelines to prevent identity theft, everyone must present a photo ID to receive an immunization. Children can only be immunized if a written prescription from a physician indicating dosage is presented.

You should NOT receive a flu shot at any of these clinics if you:

- Are allergic to eggs or the flu vaccine
- Are ill or have a fever
- Have a depressed immune system



nilla until combined. Add sugar and beat until light and fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Add flour alternately with sour cream, beginning and ending with the flour.

Drop by 3 tablespoonfuls onto greased baking sheets. With wet fingers, flatten each into a 3-inch circle. Bake 10 minutes or until edges start to brown. Cool on pan 4 minutes. Remove to wire racks to cool

In a saucepan, stir icing ingredients over low heat just until chocolate melts. Remove from heat; cool to room temperature. Using a hand

mixer beat on high until mixture thickens and becomes lighter in color, 6-7 minutes.

Spread 2 tablespoons of icing over the flat side of each cookie; let stand until set.




