

SENATE WEEK IN REVIEW

Aug. 24-28

SPRINGFIELD — As Illinois' budget impasse continues eight weeks into the 2016 fiscal year, the latest unemployment figures and economic assessment supports the Rauner Administration's push for a better business climate as part of a budget deal with the legislative majority.

The budget impasse between the administration and Democrat majorities in the Senate and House of Representatives leaves Illinois government running mostly by courtimposed orders and agreements. Only state education spending and federal funding for programs have received legislative approval and were signed into law by Gov. Bruce Rauner. The root of the budget impasse is years of fiscal mismanagement that left Illinois with few resources.

Illinois job growth lags nation

The latest report from the Illinois Department of Employment Security (IDES) shows the state ended July with an unemployment rate of 5.8 percent, down from 5.9 percent in June. Illinois also gained about 1,900 nonfarm

payroll jobs, but job growth continues to trail behind other states. IDES Director Jeff Mays said if Illinois employment growth had matched the rest of the nation this year, "Illinois would have added 40,000 more jobs by now."

That trend was confirmed by a corresponding report from the U.S. Department of Labor (DOL). According to the DOL, Illinois's rate of job growth in the past year was both slower than surrounding states and last among neighboring states in per-capita job growth. So, while the report shows that Illinois gained 50,000 jobs over the past year, our neighboring state Indiana gained 64,000 - almost 30% more - despite having only half the population.

"F" doesn't mean "friendly" for small businesses

According to an annual survey released this month, Illinois gets an "F" on its small-businesses report card. The fourth annual Small Business Friendliness Survey by Thumbtack.com, which polls nearly 18,000 small business owners across the country, gave Illinois its worst possible

grade, tied with three other states: California, Connecticut, and Rhode Island. Each of our neighboring states made out much better, ranging from a "C+" (Iowa and Kentucky) to a high of "B+" (Indiana).

Opportunity elsewhere?

Another report on Illinois' economy indicates that thousands of Illinoisans found job opportunities, in other states. The Illinois Policy Institute (IPI), a public policy think tank, cites figures from the Internal Revenue Service. IPI reports, "...in 2012, Illinois lost more taxpayers and taxpayer wealth to a greater number of states than ever before." The Institute's analysis indicates that nearly 67,000 taxpayers and their dependents left Illinois taking with them \$3.7 billion in annual income.

The reports are among many revealed in recent years and months that bolster the claim that Illinois must do more to improve its business/jobs climate. Numerous reforms to ease state regulations and lower the cost of hiring were proposed by Republican lawmakers in recent years and in 2015. The year began with hope that a new governor, elected on an argument that change was needed, would usher in a revitalized Illinois economy; however, most of the proposed changes ran into partisan opposition.

Regulation reform = economic growth

Gov. Rauner signed legislation during the week that supporters said is an example of what can be accomplished when political parties and opposing interests work together for the benefit of the entire state.

Senate Bill 1672 creates a state process for Illinois companies seeking an air permit for a new or expanded facility. Currently, companies must go through the federal govern-

ment to obtain the permits. It's a process that can take years to complete, which can lead to delays in construction and hiring or decisions not to build. Under the new state permit process, companies will receive their regulatory decision within one year. The legislation is the result of an agreement between the Attorney General's Office, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, Sierra Club/ Illinois Environmental Council, and the Illinois Chamber of Commerce. Illinois joins 41 other states with a similar process.

Other legislative action

Gov. Rauner took action on a number of bills during the week. A complete list is available on the Senate Action page of the Senate Republican Caucus Web site.

Disaster recovery assistance

Earlier this month, the U.S. Department of Agriculture granted the state's request for official disaster designa-tion covering 101 of Illinois' 102 counties, resulting from the damage caused by heavy rainfall and flooding earlier this summer. Now, the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) is making federal economic injury disaster loans available.

The disaster loans are available to small businesses, small agricultural cooperatives, and small businesses engaged in aquaculture, and private nonprofit organizations. The SBA can be contacted for applications and more information at 1-800-659-2955. Information about the Agriculture Disaster Declaration can still be obtained through county Farm Service Agency offices.

One must never lose sight that Chicago is the horsepower center of the state and the rest of us are the "red headed stepchildren" in many of their eyes. Finding total common ground will never happen. Strong leadership throughout Illinois is imperative to maintain a check and balance.

The not so skinny cook

We finally got some rain. It was wonderful not to have to water this weekend. The weather is supposed to get really warm; perhaps it is the last hurrah of summer. The heat and rain should help some of those vegetables grow. I love eating fruits and vegetables of the season, and this week's recipes will feature some of our summer's bounty.

The first recipe is for roasted tomatoes. You can use these roasted tomatoes in many main dishes. You can also use it in many appetizers. The tomatoes will keep in the refrigerator for five days or frozen for two months. If you have any extra tomatoes, this recipe is a great way to preserve them without a lot of work.

Roasted Tomatoes

3 lbs. large tomatoes, cored, bottom 1/8 inch trimmed and sliced 34 inch thick

½ t. dried oregano

Salt and pepper

³/₄ C. extra virgin olive oil

Adjust oven rack to middle position and preheat oven to 425. Line rimmed baking sheet with aluminum foil. Arrange tomatoes in even layer on prepared sheet, with larger slices around the edge and smaller slices in the center. Place the garlic cloves on the tomatoes. Sprinkle with oregano and \(^1\lambda\) t. salt and season with pepper to taste. Drizzle oil evenly over the tomatoes.

Bake for 30 minutes, rotating sheet halfway through baking. Remove the sheet from the oven. Reduce the oven temperature to 300 degrees and prop oven door to cool oven to the 300 degrees. Using thin spatula, flip tomatoes.

Return tomatoes to oven with door closed and continue to cook until spotty brown, skins are blistered, and tomatoes have collapsed to \(\frac{1}{4} \) to ½ inch thick, about 1-2 hours. Remove from oven and let cool completely, about 30 minutes. Discard garlic and transfer tomatoes and oil to an airtight container. Tomatoes can be refrigerated for up to 5 days or frozen for up to 2 months.

¹/₄ C. sugar

1 t. celery seed

1 t. ground mustard

½ t. salt

Salad

6 C. fresh baby spinach

2 medium peaches, sliced

134 C. sliced fresh mushrooms

3 hard-cooked eggs, halved and sliced

½ lb. bacon strips, cooked and crumbled

1 small red onion, halved and thinly sliced

¹/₄ C. sliced almonds, toasted Grated Parmesan cheese

Place the dressing ingredients in a blender and cover and process until blended. In a large bowl, combine the spinach, peaches, mushrooms, eggs, bacon, onion and almonds. Serve with dressing and cheese. To toast the nuts: Spread the almonds in a jelly roll pan. Bake at 350 for 5-10 minutes or until lightly

There was beautiful cabbage at the Farmer's Market. This coleslaw recipe is a creamy one because of the buttermilk. I think the buttermilk cuts the taste of the may to make it extra tasty. Have a great coleslaw side with this easy recipe.

Chopped Coleslaw

½ medium head of cabbage ½ C. finely chopped celery

½ C. finely chopped red pep-

1/3 C. finely chopped sweet onion

Dressing:

½ C. mayonnaise ¼ C. sugar

¹/₄ C. milk

¹/₄ C. buttermilk

2 t. white vinegar

½ t. hot sauce

Cut the cabbage into slices and place in food processor one half of the cabbage at a time; pulse until chopped. Transfer to a large bowl until all the cabbage has been processed.

Add the remaining vegetables to the cabbage. In a small bowl, whisk the dressing ingredients until blended. Pour over the coleslaw and toss to coat. Refrigerate for at least 1 hour before serving.

If you have a lot of zucchini (and those of you who raise zucchini always have tons of it), this soup is a great one for summer and fall. It uses a lot of zucchini and some other vegetables. The sausage gives the zucchini a little zip. soup can be made the night before and plugged in when you leave for work. Serve it with some crusty bread and a spinach salad, and you will

have a feast. You can have a heartier meal if you serve it over noodles or rice. This soup is even better the next day.

Slow Cooker Zucchini Soup

1 T. olive oil

1 lb. sausage

2 C. chopped celery

8 C. zucchini, cut crosswise into ½-inch slices

2 cans (28 oz. each) diced tomatoes, undrained

2 green peppers, cut into ½-inch wide strips

1 C. chopped onion

1 t. salt

1 t. sugar

1 t. dried oregano

1 t. Italian season

1 t. dried basil

1/4 t. garlic powder

½ C. grated parmesan cheese Heat the olive oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat until hot. Add the sausage and cook, stirring and breaking up lumps, until browned and

crumbly, 8-10 minutes. Pour off the grease. Add the celery to the sausage in the skillet and cook, stirring occasionally, until the celery is softened (about 10 minutes.)

Transfer sausage mixture to a 5 or 6 quart slow cooker. Stir in the zucchini, tomatoes (with juice), bell peppers, onion, salt, sugar, oregano, Italian seasoning, basil and garlic powder.

Cook, covered on LOW until the zucchini is tender (at least 6 hours). Serve the soup in bowls and sprinkle with teaspoons of parmesan cheese. You can serve this over rice or noodles.

Still want another zucchini recipe? This recipe pairs zucchini and fresh blueberries. It also makes a large pan, so it is a great recipe to take to a reunion or potluck. Be sure to use the two extra tablespoons of flour to toss the blueberries. They won't sink to the bottom if they are tossed in the flour. Enjoy these unique bars at any time.

Blueberry Zucchini Squares

2 C. shredded zucchini ½ C. buttermilk 1T. grated lemon peel 3 T. lemon juice 1 C. butter, softened 2½ C. sugar

31/4 C. plus 2 T. flour, divid-

1 t. baking soda ½ t. salt 2 C. fresh blueberries

Glaze:

2 C. powdered sugar ¼ C. buttermilk

1 T. grated lemon peel 2 t. lemon juice

1/8 t. salt

Preheat the oven to 350. Grease a 15 x 10 x 1 inch

baking pan. In a small bowl, combine the zucchini, buttermilk, lemon peel, and lemon juice. Toss to combine. In a large bowl, cream the butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in the eggs, one at a time. In another bowl, whisk 3½ C. flour, baking soda, and slat. Gradually add to creamed mixture, alternately with the zucchini mixture, missing well after each addition. Toss the blueberries with remaining flour and fold into the batter.

Transfer batter to the prepared pan, spreading evenly. Bake 30-35 minutes or until light golden brown and a tooth pick inserted into the center comes out clean. Cool completely in the pan.

In a small bowl, mix the glaze ingredients until smooth; spread over the top and stand until set.

The hardest part of this next recipe is crushing the gingersnaps. This great pie is easy to make and delicious also. You do need to plan ahead because you need to freeze

the crust and refrigerate the pie. If you don't have fresh peaches, you can drain a can (15oz.) of slices peaches and use them in place of the fresh peaches. If you happen to run into Anna's Ginger Cookies, they are the best. This pie is a really cool way to end summer.

No-Bake Peach Melba Pie

11/4 C. finely crushed gingersnaps

3 oz. white chocolate, melt-

1 T. butter, melted

4 oz. cream cheese, soft-

1/3 C. powdered sugar 2 T. milk

1 ½ C. whipped topping, thawed

2 peaches, peeled 2 T. raspberry jam

1 C. fresh raspberries

Combine the gingersnap crumbs, chocolate, and butter; press onto the bottom and up the side of a 9-inch pie plate sprayed with cooking spray. Freeze for 20 minutes.

In a mixing bowl, beat the cream cheese, sugar and milk

until blended. Gently stir in the whipped topping. Cut the peaches into ½-inch thick slices. Reserve 3 peach slices for garnish; wrap tightly in plastic wrap. Finely chop remaining peach slices; stir into cream cheese mixture. Spoon on to the crust. Refrigerate pie and reserved peach slices 2 hours or until pie is firm.

Before serving, microwave jam in a small bowl on HIGH for 30 seconds or just until warmed; stir and then drizzle over the pie. Garnish with raspberries and reserved peach slices.

I have to do something with the wonderful Farm Bureau peaches. I think I will make a traditional peach pie and put it in the freezer for a Labor Day picnic. I love to slice them and eat them on


