Local family reaching out to other families while raising awareness for Autism

Mitchel Wallace was 4 years old when he was diagnosed with Autism Spectrum disorder; also known as Asperger Syndrome.

On Saturday, May 13 Mitchel and family members will be participating for a third time in a 5 K walk that holds special meaning at Soldier Field in Chicago. "Walk Now for Autism Speaks" is an annual event around the country organized to raise awareness, in addition to allowing future advances in research, while lending a strong support system to families. Mitchel's immediate family is participating in the walk including his Father, Scott, Mother Kerri, Mitchel, Mitchel's sister, Emily- her boyfriend Michael, and their children Layla and the newest member of the family, baby Nova.

Mitchel's Mom Kerri reflects back where his story began, "I noticed from age two that he was not progressing as a toddler as my daughter Emily had," said Kerri Wallace. "He had little to no speech. He mostly mimicked when he did talk. He got over stimulated at places like Wal Mart with so much to visually take in. He couldn't understand simple and two step directions such as "Put the yellow ball in the box." He would become fixated with one toy and nothing else.

"I took Mitchel to the pre-k testing at Rockton Grade School and he qualified at three and a half years old. There they do all sorts of testing on all of the children. Once enrolled he qualified for speech and occupational therapy as his fine motor skills were also behind,"

"After working with that program I was able to take their report to the pediatric neurologist and incorporate it with the clinic's testing to get the diagnosis. Mitchel was in pre-k for two years and the strides he made were huge."

While still not on par with children his own age he began to speak. When he turned 18 we had wonderful conversations.

Now at age 21 Mitchel has shown great improvement through the years. Kerri attributes much of the credit to those who have helped Mitchel in various ways. "I will always be grateful to that program and to those teachers who took him under their wing."

Family and friends have also watched Mitchel's advancements first hand. "He is outwardly social with our friends. When we have company he doesn't sit in his room the whole time. He seeks out people and talks to them; he even hugs them when he greets someone," shares Kerri.

"Most people who know me have also met my little brother. Mitchel is like most siblings. Growing up we didn't have a normal brother/sister relationship because he wasn't interested. He would have rather have spent his time doing his own thing," said Emily Wallace. "Being around him gave me the chance to see people for who they really are despite not being what is considered "normal."

"Over the last three years as my friendship with Mitchel has grown I realized even my own limited knowledge of Autism was completely shattered by the man that Mitchel has become," said close family friend Steve Shannon.

of us miss. If you have at least one friend in your life that can show you what you are missing, and make you laugh while doing it you are as blessed as I am having Mitchel in my life."

"I was just talking recently about the difference in him," said close friend, Theresa Shannon. "He has gone from the kid who hoped I would go away if he didn't acknowledge I was there to the engaging young man I interact with now. He even initiates conversation."

From needing support for daily activities to now being able to have independent enjoyment in our local community is a success that should be celebrated by everyone and a testament to Mitchel's hard work and perseverance."

At the time of Mitchel's diagnosis one in 500 were diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder. Since that time the numbers have significantly changed. Autism is the second most common developmental disorder in the United States. It affects one in every 68 children born today.

The most obvious signs of Autism Mitchel has been working at the tend to appear between the ages of two

to three years old. Research is crucial. Despite some promising discoveries the cause of Autism is unknown and a cure does not exist. ASD may be characterized in varying degrees in social interaction, verbal and nonverbal communication and repetitive behavior.

ASD can be associated with intellectual disability in motor coordination, attention and physical health issues such as sleep or gastrointestinal disturbances.

Some who live with ADS excel in visual skills, math and art.

Mighty Mushroom **Blended Burger**

Prep time: 10 minutes Cook time: 15 minutes Servings: 4

- 1/2 pound any variety mushroom
- tablespoons olive oil, divided pound ground beef
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 4 buns

Finely dice mushrooms or gently pulse in food processor.

In skillet, warm 1 tablespoon olive oil on medium-high heat and add mushrooms, cooking 5-7 minutes, or until golden brown. Remove from heat and cool 5 minutes

Transfer cooled mushrooms to medium bowl. Add ground beef and salt, mixing until combined. Make four patties.

Add remaining olive oil to pan and cook burger patties on medium-high heat until internal temperature reaches at least 160 F. Plate and add desired toppings to bun.

Recommended toppings include: pickled red peppers, crumbled blue cheese and watercress greens.

t's not always easy to create meals that are both nutritious and satisfying. Managing intake of added sugar and saturated fat takes effort and planning, but transforming your favorite recipes into more nutritious family meals can be simpler than you imagined.

The nutrient-dense mushroom masterfully bridges that divide, offering rich and meaty flavor while still being fat-free, low-calorie and low-sodium. All mushrooms contain vitamin D at various levels, which helps build strong bones. Additionally, mushrooms are a source of B vitamins, including riboflavin and niacin, which help provide energy by breaking down proteins, fats and carbohydrates

"Mushrooms are an incredibly versatile ingredient," said Mary Jo Feeney, MS, RDN, nutrition research consultant for the Mushroom Council. "They can be the meaty star of a vegetarian dish or a nutritious complement to burgers and other hearty recipes."

For a healthy weekday lunch, consider building a salad bowl around the earthy mushroom. Pair roasted or marinated mushrooms with crunchy vegetables and nutty grains, beans and pulses, and top with a simple vinaigrette or squeeze of citrus.

For lightened-up versions of classics such as burgers and meatballs, try adopting a culinary technique known as "The Blend." Simply chop any mushroom variety to match the consistency of ground meat, blend the mushrooms into the meat and cook the mushroom-meat blend to complete the recipe. Substituting at least 25 percent of the meat for mushrooms can enhance the taste of your favorite meaty meals, deliver an extra serving of nutrient-rich vegetables and trim calorie and fat intake.

Roasted Mushroom and Wheat Berry Salad with Orange Curry Vinaigrette

Prep time: 10 minutes Cook time: 15 minutes Servings: 4

- ounces white button mushrooms, halved
- tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil
- 1/2 teaspoon finely ground sea salt
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper 2 cups cooked wheat berries,
- warm green onions, sliced
- tablespoons dried cranberries, chopped

Dressing:

- 2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil
- tablespoons fresh orange juice

Marinated Mushroom Bowls with Lentils and Wild Rice

Prep time: 40 minutes

Servings: 4

- 1/4 cup extra-virgin olive oil
- ned rice vinegar
- tablespoon low-sodium soy sauce teaspoons dark sesame oil
- teaspoon chili oil
- green onion, thinly sliced
- tablespoon chopped fresh cilantro
- teaspoon sesame seeds
- ounces crimini mushrooms, thinly sliced
- 2 cups thinly sliced purple cabbage tablespoon fresh lime juice
- pinch of salt teaspoons low-sodium soy sauce
- cups cooked French lentils
- cup cooked wild rice 1 cup chopped cucumber

To serve, arrange equal amount of mushrooms, cabbage, lentils, wild rice and cucumbers in each bowl. Drizzle with remaining marinade and garnish with chopped cilantro, sliced green onions and black sesame seeds. Serve with lime wedges.

Note: Can be served at room temperature or cold.





Emojimania has taken over the cyberworld

You could say it started with the simple, round smiling yellow face back in the historic happy hippy days of the 1960s. It's when Yellow Smiley was first created. Love, peace, smiles and all that jazz.

For decades, Smiley was just Smiley - the iconic symbol that communicated happiness in any and every language. The word emoji hadn't even been invented yet.

But the future had much in store for Smiley as he (or maybe she) made the leap from hippy culture hard copy to modern day digital. This happened in the late 1990s in Japan, where the first emojis originated on cell phones. The simple Yellow Smiley exploded into myriad round yellow faces – from happy

to sad to winky-face and everything in between.

Along with emotional emojis came objects, ideas, the weather and so on. There are infinite possibilities for communicating about food, travel, animals, plants and anything else an emoji artist can create. If you can draw it, you can emoji it.

The Japanese couldn't keep their emoji ingenuity a secret for very long. A decade or so after their inception, Smiley and his friends made the digital trip over to the U.S. (and other countries worldwide) and pretty soon everyone was using the face with tears of joy to communicate how they felt about being able to express their feelings with a single click of the keyboard. It might feel like emojis have

been around for a long time (feels that way to me). But here in the U.S. it's been less than a decade. The first cell phones with readily

available emoji capabilities were released in the U.S. in 2011. According to Emojipedia (which actually exists) there are currently 1,851 emoji characters, with another 69 set to be released in June of this year.

We currently have lots of yellow April's due date, unfortunately). emoto-faces to choose from including smiling, dizzy, worried and confounded. There's also smiling cat face, people with bunny ears partying (so many uses for that one), thumbs up, thumbs down, various colored hearts, camels (one and two humps), blood type emojis, zodiac emojis, fire, water, beer, wine, pizza, French fries, toilet, bomb and pile of poo – just to name a few.

Emojis continue to evolve. They became racially diverse in 2015. Gendered emojis hit our screens in 2016. Some of the 69 scheduled for release in June include vomiting, a brain, zombie (male and female), breastfeeding (female), broccoli (unisex) and a giraffe (a little past

If my facts are correct, it took until 2017 to get a breastfeeding emoji, but we've had access to the smiling pile of poo as well as two options for camel for years. Anyone besides me see some irony there?

Emojis aren't just multiplying. They are diversifying – beyond text messages and social media - into the courtroom, boardroom, big screen, dictionary and even the doctor's of-

Legal experts are discussing whether emojis should be admissible in court. A movie and stage play starring emojis – have been made or are in the works. Oxford Dictionaries named the face with tears of joy emoji as its 2015 word of the

At least one online service helps potential patients find doctors and schedule appointments using emojis instead of words to describe their medical conditions. For instance, combining the cat emoji with a sneezing smiley face indicates allergies. A heart combined with fire equals – you guessed it – heartburn. So. Very. Clever.

Which obviously brings us back to the pile of poo. The possibilities for diagnosis are practically endless. I'd give that a smiling thumb's up or in emoji-speak: C

Illinois State Police (ISP) Troopers across the state participated in the first ever "distracted driving awareness week." During this enforcement campaign Troopers gave special attention to distracted driving, while still enforcing other violations of the Illinois Vehicle Code

The initiative was sponsored by the Illinois Association of Chiefs of Police (ILACP), in partnership with AAA, and supported by the Illinois State Police, SafetyServe.com, the National Safety Council, the Illinois Insurance Association, and nearly 300 other law enforcement and fire agencies throughout Illinois. A press conference was held at the Illinois State Capitol on April 24, 2017 to kick off the campaign.

During the enforcement period from April 24-28, ISP Troopers issued 1,146 distracted driving citations and 984 distracted driving warnings. Troopers also issued 3,276 citations for other violations of the IVC and 3,182 written warnings.

In addition to the enforcement campaign, the ISP also undertook a large education effort to inform motorists of distracted driving laws. Safety Education Officers (SEOs) throughout the state spent over 160 hours educating the public and motorists on the current laws, penalties, and rules of the road.

"I am extremely proud of the enforcement efforts by the ISP. Our officers proudly represented the ISP in this statewide campaign," said ISP Colonel Tad Williams. "Additionally, our SEO's did a great job educating the motoring public through a number of press conferences, media releases, and multitude of social media contacts," Williams added.

The use of wireless telephones for all drivers, regardless of age, while operating a vehicle in a school zone or construction zone is prohibited. Also, the use of electronic communication devices or any other electronic device, to text, e-mail, compose, read or send electronic messages or access internet sites while driving a motor vehicle is prohibited.






