Stone House Herbs grow beyond culinary into wellness

Outside of Shannon on Bolton Road there is an old 1855 farmstead. The prominent feature of the property as you enter the driveway is the nineteenth century stone house. Today, the property that had once been a typical farm, growing corn, beans and raising dairy cattle has evolved into something very different and untraditional. Today, the original farmstead has become the Stone House Herb Company.

Beth Nagle has been in Stephenson County for 17 years. For the last four years she has operated Stone House Herb Company on her property. On approximately a half acre Nagle is growing more than 50 different kinds of herbs. When people think of herbs, most assume that herbs are meant exclusively as food additives. Certainly, basil or rosemary can add flavor to a recipe and Nagle does have culinary herbs for sale in potted plants or harvested. For thousands of years, however, herbs have been used for more than just seasoning meals. Nagle, who is a certified Master Herbalist said, "My greater interest is what can be made from herbs rather than simply using them for a kitchen garden. These plants make excellent teas, tinctures or incense.

Folklore and legend speak about ancestors of all people using herbs as remedies for any number of ailments including such issues as anxiety, stomach problems or headaches.

Nagle said, "I raise herbs that can easily be made into tinctures or teas. Right now I have several plots and we grow a number of different herbs. I'm growing plants such as mug wort, hops, tansy and others.'

Nagle sells potted herb plants to those who wish to grow gardens of their own. Nagle said, "We have mug wort, for instance, which when it's added to an herbal tea can be helpful with digestive problems. Seemingly, it also enhances our dreams. Any of the mints we offer can be made into a tea which has a calming effect. Tansy is an excellent insect repellant."

In a small stone building that was at one time a milk house, Nagle has on display a myriad of naturalist products. On the tables can be found bottles of floral essence made from passion flower, poppies or hops. Mint teas are available as well as teas such as chamomile, lavender or catnip. Nagle pointed out the calamint smudge sticks, a tightly bound bundle of dried, woody resinous herbs. The bundles are burned to cleanse and purify the air during Native American purification rites.

Alongside the half acre growing plot is large dome of tangled leafy vines. To the untrained eye it appears as if the green dome is nothing more than a tangle of weeds. When asked, Nagle said, "Those are hops growing on a hoop house frame and no, I'm not brewing beer. Hops are believed to be a remedy for anxiety. The name of this particular variety of hop is



When Bethany and Dave Nagel moved from the Chicago suburbs to rural Shannon she knew they would find a better life. She was already interested in finding fresher healthier foods and knew a little about the benefits of buying local produce, but an herb garden was her dream and she was willing to do whatever it took to make that dream come true.

Beneath the dome of hops sits a small bench providing a shady, tranquil resting place.

Nagle hopes to try something

genuinely different next year. Nagle said, "Next year, in July, we hope to have a full moon magic herb gathering. Those who wish to join us will

be picking their herbs under the light of the moon which many believe has an energizing effect on people.'

When not looking at potted plants or the packaged herbals that are for sale, a person can wander around the farm and become friends with the several dogs, cats and llama's that are on the property.

To receive a pre-participation sports screening come to a walk-in clinic on July 19 from 4-6 p.m. or August 2 from 4-5:30 p.m. at Monroe Clinic Family Medicine, 515 22nd Avenue, Monroe, Wis.

Pre-participation sports screenings

address any health issues or injuries in preparation for the next sports season. These screenings do not replace complete physicals. Incoming ninth grade students are not eligible to receive a pre-participation screening and should receive a full school physical in order to fully address adolescent health issues. Insurance is not billed, so there is a \$20 fee payable at the time of screening by cash, check or credit.

If athletes cannot make the July or August walk-in clinics, wellness physicals are available. Extended hours for athletes in June, July, and August make it convenient to come in and complete this wellness physical for the year. Wellness physicals are a comprehensive health analysis and are covered by most insurance com-





Attorneys General file lawsuit against Education Secretary DeVos for delaying rules that protect students & taxpayers from abuse by predatory for-profit schools

and 18 other attorneys general filed a lawsuit against the U.S. Department of Education and Education Secretary Betsy DeVos for abandoning critical federal protections that were set to go into effect on July 1.

The lawsuit, filed in U.S. District Court in the District of Columbia, alleges the Department of Education violated federal law by abruptly rescinding its Borrower Defense Rule, which cracked down on abusive higher education institutions that defraud students by allowing those students to obtain loan forgiveness. The rule was finalized in November 2016 following the collapse of Corinthian Colleges, a national for-profit chain that operated Everest College campuses in the Chicago area before its closure. The rule also provides automatic relief for students who are unable to finish their degrees because their school closes. In Illinois, there are over 50 closed campuses. Under the Borrower Defense Rule, former students of those schools who did not take out subsequent federal student loans qualify for automatic

'Students should not have to pay for student loans they obtained to attend fraudulent schools that promised education and training that they did not provide," Madigan said. "The Department of Education has clear evidence of Corinthian's widespread fraud, yet it has delayed relief for thousands of these former students and others who are still on the hook for their student

In May, Secretary DeVos announced the Department was reevaluating the Borrower Defense Rule. On June 14, the Department announced its intent to delay large portions of the Borrower Defense Rule without soliciting, receiving, or responding to any comment from any stakeholder or member of the public and without engaging in a public deliberative process. The Department simultaneously announced its intent to issue a new regulation to replace the Borrower Defense Rule.

In a short notice published in the Federal Register, the Department cited pending litigation in the case Calsecondary Schools (CAPPS) v. Betsy DeVos as the reason for delaying implementation of the Borrower Defense Rule. Madigan was among a coalition of attorneys general who filed a motion to intervene in the CAPPS case last month to defend students and taxpayers from the legal challenge to the Borrower Defense Rule brought by a trade association representing for-profit schools. Madigan and other attorneys general argued in their lawsuit filed today that "the Department's reference to the pending litigation is a mere pretext for repealing the Rule and replacing it with a new rule that will remove or dilute student rights

Without the protections of the current Borrower Defense Rule, many students who are harmed by the misconduct of for-profit schools are unable to seek a remedy in court. For-profit schools commonly require students to sign mandatory arbitration agreements and class action waivers to avoid legal actions by students who have been harmed by schools' abusive conduct. The Borrower Defense Rule limits the ability of schools to use mandatory arbitration agreements and class action waivers.

Today's lawsuit asks the court to declare the Department's delay notice unlawful and order the Department

The Department of Education's negotiated rulemaking committee helped develop the Borrower Defense Rule - in large part as a result of state and federal investigations into for-profit schools, such as Corinthian Colleges. Under the rule, a successful enforcement action against a school by a state attorney general entitles borrowers to obtain loan forgiveness, and enables the Department of Education to seek repayment of any amounts forgiven from the school.

Attorney General Madigan has investigated numerous for-profit schools for fraud and repeatedly called on the U.S. Department of Education to immediately forgive federal loans of students who attended fraudulent for-profit schools.

Madigan's office runs a free Student Loan Helpline to provide student borrowers with free resources about repayment options, avoiding default or to file a complaint about loan servicing at (800) 455-2456 (TTY: 1-800-964-3013). More information can also be found on her website.

Illinois has a budget

The state's two-year budget impasse came to an end this week as the General Assembly passed a budget. Included in that budget, the state's personal income tax rate, which goes into effect retroactive to July 1, will increase from 3.75 percent to 4.95 percent, and the corporate income tax rate would increase from 5.25 percent to 7 percent.

How will these increases affect Illinoisans?





Illinois State Police District 16 lists June activity and enforcement

Illinois State Police District 16 Operations Officer, Lt. Carl Heintz, announced today activity and enforcement figures for the month of June. Troopers in District 16, which includes 4 counties, handled 1307 incidents during the month.

In addition, enforcement figures totaled 837 citations and 379 written warnings, including 366 speeding cita-tions, 20 DUIs, 119 seatbelt citations, 6 child restraint citations, 130 written warn-ings for

speeding, and 26 criminal arrests. Troopers also assisted 105 motorists, conducted 87 Motor Carrier Inspections, and declared 18 of those commercial drivers or vehicles "Out of Service". Troopers investigated 36 traffic crashes, and there were 3 fatal traffic crashes in District 16 during June.





The not so skinny cook

I hope you all had a great Fourth of July celebration. There were fireworks all around, and the weather was perfect for a cookout. I can't believe we will be in the middle of July by next weekend. Time is flying, and I still have things to do!! This week's recipes are a potpourri of tastes and colors. Enjoy each and every one of them because they are easy and good

The first recipe is for refrigerator dill pickles. This one has you use the small cucumbers that are just arriving at the Farmer's Markets and your gardens. The great thing about these pickles is they will keep in the refrigerator for a month. A suggestion wash your jars in the dish washer to make sure they are really clean and

Refrigerator Garlic, **Dill Spears**

6 garlic cloves, peeled

- 4 t. dill seed
- 2 t. black peppercorns
- 3 lbs. small cucumbers
- 21/4 C. apple cider vinegar
- 21/4 C. water
- 2 T. plus ¾ t. pickling salt

Divide garlic, dill and peppercorns between 2 clean quart jars. Wash cucumbers and trim away the ends. Cut each into spears. Pack the spears vertically and snugly into jars.

Stir together vinegar, water, and salt in a small pot and bring to a boil. Carefully pour or ladle hot brine into the jars, covering the cucumbers and leaving ½ inch headspace. Tap the jars gently to remove any air bubbles, and add more brine if necessary to leave the ½ inch headspace. Wipe the rims clean with a damp paper

Let cool completely at least one hour. Apply clean lids and chill in the fridge at least 48 hours before eating for the best flavor. The flavor will improve with time. Store in the fridge up to one month.

This salad is very different because I think you could use it as a dessert or a salad. You can use all blackberries or raspberries. I think the strawberries mixed with other berries is better than just plain strawberries or blueberries; however, use what you like!

Beery Cheesecake Salad

4 oz. cream cheese, softened

½ C. sour cream

1 pkg. (3.4 oz.) Jell-O Cheesecake Flavor Instant Pudding

8 C. of a mixture of blackberries, olueberries, raspberries, sliced straw-

Beat the cream cheese and sour cream in a large bowl with a mixer until blended. Gradually add the

Add the dry pudding mix and beat for 2 minutes. Stir in the fruit. Refrigerate at least 1 hour. This salad is great served with graham crackers.

This is an interesting combination of potatoes and green beans. It is not really a mayo filled salad, and the Dijon mustard gives it just a little tang.

Potato Salad

½ lb. red potatoes

4 oz. fresh green beans, trimmed and halved on a bias

3 T. white wine vinegar

2 T. mayonnaise

1 T. extra-virgin olive oil

2 t. Dijon mustard

½ t. honey

Salt and black pepper to taste

½ C. halved grape tomatoes

2 T. chopped green onions

Cook the potatoes in a pot of boiling salted water 8 minutes. Add green beans and cook until potatoes are fork-tender, 3-4 minutes more; drain, transfer to a bowl, and let cool.

Whisk together vinegar, mayo, oil, Dijon and honey for the dressing; season with salt and pepper.

Add the tomatoes and onions to potato and green beans mixture and toss with dressing to coat; chill until

This recipe is an easy one to have as a side or a main dish for a vegetarian meal. You can add a salad and some crusty bread, and you have a great meal.

Stuffed Spinach

1 pkg. (10 oz.) frozen chopped spinach, thawed and squeezed dry

34 C. bread crumbs

½ C. butter, melted

1/4 C. grated Parmesan cheese

3 large eggs, lightly beaten

1½ t. pepper

Sliced tomatoes

Preheat the oven to 350. Lightly grease an 8 x 8 baking dish. In a large bowl, combine the spinach, bread crumbs, butter, cheese, eggs and pepper. Spoon the mixture into the prepared dish and bake for 15-18 minutes or until firm. Garnish with

You can make this main dish the day before. It does make two casseroles, so it would feed a crowd. You probably could buy the shredded cheeses already packaged, but shredding your own gives the dish a better flavor. This hearty chicken dish is full of good "stuff" and easy to make. You can use rotisserie chicken to make it even easier.

Chicken Enchiladas

1 box (6.8 oz.) Spanish rice 1 C. chopped onion

1 pkg. (8 oz.) cream cheese, softened

2 blocks Monterey Jack cheese (8 oz. each), shredded

1 block Colby Jack cheese, shred-1/4 C. minced fresh parsley or ci-

2 T. ground cumin

1 T. fresh lime juice

2 t. ground coriander

½ t. salt

4 C. shredded cooked chicken

16 burrito-size flour tortillas 1 can (19 oz.) enchilada sauce

Preheat the oven to 350. Spray 2

(9 x 13) baking dishes with cooking spray. Prepare the Spanish rice according to package directions. Stir onion into hot rice.

In a large bowl, combine the Spanish rice mixture, pinto beans, cream cheese, 2 cups Monterey Jack cheese, Colby Jack cheese, cilantro, cumin, lime juice, coriander and salt. Add the chicken, stirring to combine. Spoon about ½ cup filling onto center of each tortilla; roll up tortilla

Place the enchiladas, seam side down, in a single layer in the sprayed baking dishes. Top evenly with enchilada sauce. Sprinkle with remaining 2 cups, Monterey Jack cheese. Bake for 35-45 minutes or until hot and bubbly. Garnish with cilantro,

This is a perfect summer cake. If you don't have an oven safe baking bowl, you could make it in two layers (You would have to split one or use 3 round layer pans). The bowl gives it a different shape. You can use either canned (drained) or fresh pineapple and fresh oranges or drained mandarin oranges.




