Elizabeth woman sentenced in child's death case

An Elizabeth, Illinois woman, who has previous convictions from other crimes in Wisconsin, has been sentenced to 16-and-a-half years in prison for killing her infant son last May.

On Feb. 1, 2018, Elizabeth M. Roen, 27, of Elizabeth, Illinois pled guilty as part of a plea agreement to the charge of Aggravated Battery: Great Bodily Harm, which is a Class X Felony. As a result of her plea of guilty, Ms. Roen was sentenced by Judge William A. Kelly to 16.5 years in the Illinois Department of Corrections. She will serve 85% of her sentence and upon her release: Roen will be on Mandatory Supervised Release (formerly known as parole) for three years. She will also be required to register under the Murder and Violent Offender against Children Registration Act.

The charge Ms. Roen pled guilty to indicated she knowingly caused great bodily harm to "T.L.", a child under the age of 13 years, in that she covered the mouth and nose of "T.L." with her hand, which resulted in the suffocation and death of "T.L.".

Roen's prior convictions in Grant County, WI include two counts of child abuse in 2009 and a sex crimes conviction in 2010, which led to her having to register as a sex offender.

The 2009 conviction stems from an investigation in the Village of Livingston, WI, involving Roen's two-year-old daughter.

According to the 2009 criminal complaint, Roen, then 19, told investigators she had turned on the tap in the bathtub, which came out cold at

first. She left the child standing in the water and went back to change the sheets. When she returned, she noticed her daughter's feet were starting to blister. The toddler also had a black eye and a cut below her eye, but she was not taken to the hospital until the following day, according to the Grant County Sheriff's Department.

A doctor in Madison who examined the child's injuries told investigators, "This incident definitely didn't happen the way (Roen) presented it and this was definitely a physical abuse of a child case." He said the burns on her hands were consistent with dipping or immersion injuries, but at a preliminary hearing in Lancaster, WI., Judge George Curry ruled that the evidence supported a charge of reckless child abuse, but not intentional and said the child's injuries could be accidental as easily as they could be intentional.

A Grant County jury later found

Roen guilty of child abuse and recklessly causing bodily harm to a child, but noted the foster care home where she was staying with her child had the water heater setting too high. The foster parents received a monetary fine.

Then in 2010, Roen was found guilty of having sexual intercourse with her brother and was sentenced to five years probation and three months in jail with work release.

Police in Elizabeth, on May 11, 2017 responded to a call of a baby not breathing. Emergency crews took six-month-old TL to the hospital where he later died. Authorities said Roen told investigators the baby would not stop crying and that she was "frustrated" and "lost it."

The Elizabeth Police Department, Jo Daviess County Sheriff's Office and the Critical Incident Response Team (CIRT) Investigative Unit handled the investigation of the Jo Daviess County case.

Stockton Civil War Reenactment cancelled


After a lot of soul-searching, the Stockton Civil War Reenactment Committee has made the very difficult decision to end the event.





fields in distant venues. This past weekend they carried a fourth-place finish with them, from an involved Invitational in Litchfield, nearly four hours away.



What is the story behind Valentines' Day?

On Feb. 14, around the year 278 A.D., Valentine, a holy priest in Rome in the days of Emperor Claudius II, was executed.

Under the rule of Claudius the Cruel, Rome was involved in many unpopular and bloody campaigns. The emperor had to maintain a strong army, but was having a difficult time getting soldiers to join his military leagues. Claudius believed that Roman men were unwilling to join the army because of their strong attachment to their wives and families.

To get rid of the problem, Claudius banned all marriages and engagements in Rome. Valentine, realizing the injustice of the decree, defied Claudius and continued to perform marriages for young lovers in secret.

When Valentine's actions were discovered. Claudius ordered that he be put to death. Valentine was arrested and dragged before the Prefect of Rome, who condemned him to be beaten to death with clubs and to have his head cut off. The sentence was carried out on Feb. 14, on or

Legend also has it that while in jail, St. Valentine left a farewell note for the jailer's daughter, who had become his friend, and signed it "From Your Valentine.'

For his great service, Valentine was named a saint after his death.

In truth, the exact origins and identity of St. Valentine are unclear. According to the Catholic Encyclopedia, "At least three different Saint Valentines, all of them martyrs, are mentioned in the early martyrologies under the date of 14 February." One was a priest in Rome, the second one was a bishop of Interamna (now Terni, Italy) and the third St. Valentine

was a martyr in the Roman province of Africa.

Legends vary on how the martyr's name became connected with romance. The date of his death may have become mingled with the Feast of Lupercalia, a pagan festival of love. On these occasions, the names of young women were placed in a box, from which they were drawn by the men as chance directed. In 496 AD, Pope Gelasius decided to put an end to the Feast of Lupercalia, and he declared that Feb. 14 be celebrated as St Valentine's Day.

Gradually, Feb. 14 became a date for exchanging love messages, poems and simple gifts such as flowers.

Hornets pick-up post-season start-up position

Done over by flu? Don't overdo it with acetaminophen

While the flu always has the potential to be deadly, you may not know about a hidden danger lurking in your medicine cabinet, especially during cold and flu season: acetaminophen (Tylenol).

Acetaminophen is a common drug for treating flu symptoms, like fever and chills, muscle and body aches, headaches, and sore throats. Acetaminophen, however, can't do it all; in order to treat a cough or runny nose, someone experiencing flu symptoms usually turns to additional over-the-counter products for relief. And here's where trouble can arise: multi-symptom cold symptom relief

ophen. The maximum daily dose of acetaminophen recommended by McNeal, the maker of Tylenol, is 3,000 mg for adults. The dosing for children is based on weight; age and/ or weight-based dosing is on the back of boxes, vials and containers of pediatric formulations of acetaminophen to help guide caregivers. If a person takes multiple acetaminophen-containing products, the math can quickly add up to a potentially toxic dose.

For example, let's say an adult takes Vicks DayQuilTM multi-symptom relief medication four times a day. Each dose of the medication contains 650 mg of acetaminophen, for a total daily dose 2,600 mg. If this

dose of TYLENOL® Extra Strength, they're already over the recommended limit of 3,000 mg per day. Furthermore, if they don't realize both products contain acetaminophen and take the maximum recommended dose of both products in a single day they'll have ingested 5,600 mg, a potentially toxic amount. And that doesn't even take into account a dose of Vicks Ny-QuilTM at bedtime, which would put the patient at 6,250 mg of acetaminophen. Adhering to the labeled daily acetaminophen dose is paramount because too much of this drug is a well-documented cause of liver damage, which can lead to liver transplant

or even death. An eye-opening report in a recent New York Times article highlights this very real and dangerous issue. The patient, a 20-year-old pregnant woman, had been battling flu-like symptoms, and as her condition worsened, she presented to the hospital emergency department for a third

person also takes a single, 500 mg time. Blood laboratory abnormalities Poison Center (IPC) was consulted indicated significant liver damage. A doctor in the ICU eventually discovered that the patient unknowingly overdosed on acetaminophen by taking twice the recommended daily dose for several days. She was treated with an intravenous antidote, and fortunately, she made a full recovery.

When acetaminophen doses are repeatedly exceeded, or a single large overdose occurs, acetaminophen damages the liver.

Certain patient populations may be at greater risk for acetaminophen-induced liver damage, even at recommended doses. Conditions associated with poor dietary intake—including viral illnesses like the common cold flu, AIDS, pregnancy, chronic heavy alcohol use, and anorexia—can decrease the liver's ability to avoid the toxic effects of excess acetaminophen. Nationally, U.S. poison control centers receive over 100,000 cases involving acetaminophen annually. In 2017, the Illinois

on 5,000 cases involving acetaminophen. These statistics make it one of the most common drugs involved in accidental poisonings and intentional drug overdoses.

This doesn't mean acetaminophen-containing products shouldn't be used when needed. Rather, individuals should always follow the instructions listed on medications carefully, pay special attention to label warnings and be aware of all the ingredients in over-the-counter cold products—and any other kind of medication. Do exactly as the TV and radio ads suggest and "use only as directed." If you have any questions about acetaminophen, consult your physician or pharmacist or call the IPC at 1-800-222-1222. By taking these precautions, you can at least breathe easy (figuratively speaking) about medication safety-and hopefully, it won't be long before your flu relief medicine has you literally breathing easy as well.

The seven ways to prepare for a home fire

- 1. Install the right number of smoke alarms. Test them once a month and replace the batteries at least once a year.
- 2. Teach children what smoke alarms sound like and what to do when they
- 3. Ensure that all household members know two ways to escape from every room of your home and know the family meeting spot outside of your home.
- 4. Establish a family emergency communications plan and ensure that all household members know who to contact if they cannot find one another.
- 5. Practice escaping from your home at least twice a year. Press the smoke alarm test button or yell "Fire" to alert everyone that they must get out.
- 6. Make sure everyone knows how to call 9-1-1.
- 7. Teach household members to STOP, DROP and ROLL if their clothes should catch on fire.

Certified Livestock Manager training to be held in Freeport sics of nutrient management as well

University of Illinois Extension has scheduled workshops to provide Illinois livestock producers the manure management training they need to meet the requirements of the state's Livestock Management Facilities

Locally, Certified Livestock Manager Training will be hosted by the University of Illinois Extension on

Wednesday, Feb. 14, at the Stephenson County Farm Bureau, 210 W Spring Street, Freeport. The workshop begins promptly at 9 a.m. and will take 3 1/2 hours with the IDOA exam administered afterward.

The workshop will offer a general curriculum designed to keep producers current on the latest industry practices. The curriculum covers the ba-

as new technologies, research, and trends, so producers who have completed the training and are renewing their certification will benefit.

The Livestock Management Facilities Act requires facilities with 300 or more animal units to have at least one employee certified in proper manure handling procedures. For facilities with 300 to 999 animal units, the employee must attend a workshop or pass the Illinois Department of Agriculture's Certified Livestock Manager exam. Employees of facilities with 1,000 or more animal units must do both to achieve certification.

Registration is now open at 217-244-9687 or register online at web. extension.illinois.edu/lfmm/certification.html. The cost is \$35. If more than one employee from the same farm signs up, each additional registration will cost \$25. Lunch will not be offered, but coffee and donuts will be provided.
