Danica Patrick ends racing career with crash at Indy 500

13 GoDaddy Chevrolet for Ed Carpenter Racing, was credited with a 30th-place finish in the Indianapolis 500 following an accident in Turn 2

After starting the race from the seventh position, Patrick pitted under green flag conditions at lap 29 and again under caution at lap 50. Patrick took the green flag in the 14th position at lap 55.

On Lap 68, the No. 13 GoDaddy

Chevrolet spun in Turn 2 and made contact with both the inside and outside retaining walls, causing significant damage to the car. Patrick was evaluated and released from the infield medical center.

Danica Patrick, driver of the No. 13 GoDaddy Chevrolet for Ed Carpenter Racingl know that's not how you wanted your day to end. What happened?

"I do feel like it was unexpected, but on the other hand, the car was turning more than I wanted it to. I was just having to chase it a lot. Turn 2 did seem a little bit more edgy than the other corners, but I can't say that in that point in time that I was on edge or felt like I was.

"It just swung around as soon as I committed back to the throttle. I wasn't expecting it by any means, but I think it just goes to show that these cars are tough to drive. All the drivers out there are great drivers. It was definitely not the way I wanted to end, of course.

"I wouldn't want to end any year like this, but being my last race, it definitely makes it a lot worse. I did have some good moments here this month. I won't forget that, and I won't forget my fans either.'

The Winnebago County teacher is Erikka Colleta of Stone Creek Elementary in Roscoe. The Boone County teacher is Tina Babcock of Poplar Grove Elementary.

The award was inspired by its first recipient Estella Crespo. Ms. Crespo, who works in the Rockford Public School District, was honored for her consistent dedication to the AITC program. For the past two years, the Farm Bureau has honored teachers who show similar enthusiasm and commitment to the program.

After spending some time in business, Erikka Colleta decided she wanted to make a difference with her work. So, she decided to teach. She has been teaching for 18 years in the Kinnikinn-

ick School District. During that time, she has definitely made a difference in the lives of many children. Colleta saw her own kids benefit from AITC, so she decided to implement it into her classroom. "Roscoe is a rural area, but most of my students don't have a connection to agriculture," said Colleta, "They need to experience it and seeing

products in their pure form helps a lot.' AITC aligns well with Next Generation Science Standards and most of their lessons have a STEM approach. Their AG MAG reading materials promote nonfiction reading and comprehension. Colleta has seen this positively impact her classroom and her students' ability to apply what they learn to real life. "My students can now make connections between what they see in the grocery store and where it comes from," said Colleta, "They even know how agriculture impacts the economy."

family's 4-H and Farm Bureau experiences, organizes Ag in the Classroom for three third-grade classes in Poplar Grove. "All of the students have benefited from lessons in agriculture on a variety of topics during the school year," said Babcock.

She has seen the AITC program add to her curriculum. "They connect what they've learned in AITC presentations to texts, class discussions and experiences outside of school. In the last unit of our social studies curriculum, we focus on agriculture in our area as well as in other regions of the country," said Babcock. Through her over 20 years of teaching, she has found that "students do not know what we think they ought to know about agriculture." AITC is able to help bridge

Rockford Chapter NSDAR holds 'Evening of Remembrance and Reflection'

As a Memorial Day Event and a commemoration of the 50th Anniversary of the Vietnam War, Rockford Chapter NSDAR invited the public to an evening ceremony of "Remembrance and Reflection," honoring the heroes who died in combat and those who returned from the Vietnam War and later succumbed to illnesses from 'Agent Orange.'

Attendees witnessed the faces of these veterans that were reflected off the wall of the memorial as their names were called and a bell tolled in memory of their sacrifice for our country.

Information supplied by DAR member Inis Bloomster noted, "Mav 28, 2012 through November 11, 2025, had been proclaimed by President Obama so that we, as a grateful nation, might honor these heroes through programs, ceremonies and activities. More than 58,000 patriots gave their lives during the Vietnam War to secure democracy for future generations. The Wall in Washington, D.C. has the names of those who sacrificed all they had, etched in black granite. The committee that oversees that wall, determined that there should be a picture of each patriot on a kiosk located at the site.

"The National Society Daughters of the American Revolution was asked by the Defense Department to partner with the Vietnam Veterans Association to help find pictures of the men and women who gave the ultimate sacrifice, to commemorate the 50th Anniversary of that war.

"After the DAR Continental Congress was held, each representative of the 3,000 DAR Chapters went home with instructions to search for pictures of these heroes. With the help of Honorary Regent Bloomster, Rena Snyder and the Rockford Public Library, the Rockford Chapter was able to find all the pictures of the 71 patriots from Winnebago County who died in combat. After the Chapter displayed a collage of pictures at a function, it became evident that something should be done locally so our heroes' young and handsome faces could be remembered.

"Our city, Rockford has a 'crown jewel' waiting for your visit! The LZ Peace Memorial is that jewel and is located at Midway Village and Museum Center, 6799 Guilford Road. Returning veterans formed the Viet-

nam Veterans Honor Society and created this beautiful monument that was dedicated in 2005. The names of Winnebago County patriots who gave the ultimate sacrifice are etched into the black granite Wall of Honor.

"LZ' stands for 'Landing Zone."
These locations in Vietnam were places where hope and medical treatment for wounded soldiers could be found. The medical helicopters used them to evacuate the injured.

"One of those Hueys is on display at the memorial and the Vietnam Veterans Honor Society felt the name, LZ Peace Memorial, was a natural name for a place to honor the Veterans of Winnebago County who made the ultimate sacrifice. he Rockford Chapter felt it would be the perfect place to put the pictures of the men on display as well.

"On Memorial Day in 2015, a display case, donated by the Rockford Park District, was unveiled at the LZ Peace Memorial. Members of the Rockford Chapter were on hand to participate in the event. The case was erected so that the faces of the heroes were facing the granite wall bearing their names. At that presentation, one Vietnam veteran said, 'This is a long-awaited act of healing.'

"In addition to the Wall of Faces, the Rockford Chapter had a banner made and these men have been remembered at the Rockford Airfest, the Wall of Healing, and they 'marched' in the Memorial Day, Fourth of July and Veterans Day parades.

"Many citizens of Rockford are unaware that the LZ Peace Memorial is the only one of its kind in America. It not only has the granite wall with the names of Winnebago County combat casualties and the wall of faces but it also bears the names of men who have died from Agent Orange.

"Agent Orange is a powerful herbicide and defoliant containing trace amounts of dioxin, a toxic impurity suspected of causing serious health problems, including cancer, genetic damage in some persons exposed to it and birth defects in their off-spring. It was used by the U.S. armed forces during the Vietnam War to defoliate jungles. It is called Agent Orange because of the color of the stripe on the container it was stored in.

"Many Vietnam Veterans are succumbing to illness caused by having contact with this defoliant. A quote from the program from the last Agent Orange Memorial Service on May 6,

2017 says, 'They weren't killed in the war but Vietnam is what killed them. One day they're listening to the iconic 'Paint It Black' and the next day it's Taps 'blowin' in the wind.'

"Veterans who have died from Agent Orange have been added to the memorial periodically. The Rockford Chapter NSDAR is honored to be a part of this historical monument and we have been following and archiving the Vietnam Veterans who have died from the effects of Agent Orange."

The Vietnam Veterans Society plaque at the LZ Peace Memorial notes: "We honor their commitment and devotion..."

The Rockford Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution member Inis Bloomster spent approximately two and half years tracking down pictures of the county's Vietnam casualties and Agent Orange victims for a slide presentation held at the LZ Peace Memorial May 27. All the names were read while a bell tolled for each serviceman. Many of the Agent Orange casualties have passed on within the last decade or two - their number as high as those killed in action during the war.

SHARING **AWARENESS**

During a routine screening, Kevin Harlan was told to see a specialist to have his carotid arteries checked. An ultrasound at OSF HealthCare Cardiovascular Institute revealed the Peoria television station executive's left artery was blocked, putting him at risk for a stroke. Senate passes Syverson's legislation to combat robo-calls

veloping new tools to combat the seemingly endless, and still growing, issue of robo-calls, thanks to legislation filed by State Sen. Dave Syverson (R-Rockford) that passed the Illinois Senate on May 25.

"These calls aren't about sales or capitalism, they are pure harassment," said Syverson. "This legislation will allow us to put together new methods of combating the constant menace of robo-calls.

Syverson's Senate Joint Resolution 59 would create the bipartisan Illinois Automated Dialing and Solicitation Task Force. The members of the task force would study penalties for violating the Do Not Call List and penalties for call spoofing, as well as exploring any new technology for preventing robo-calls.

The task force would be made up of four members of the General Assembly, one member appointed by the governor, two members from the Illinois Attorney General's office, one member from the Illinois State Police Department, and five members from the telecommunications industry appointed by the Governor and the four legislative leaders.

"The panel will enable us to develop real solutions to stop the calls and punish those responsible," said Syverson. "We will also have the opportunity to look at technology that can prevent these types of calls from


