



It's time to go for a walk in the woods

A year ago, I wrote about “forest bathing,” the name given to spending time in the trees. We know sun bathing provides needed Vitamin D. Forest bathing provides scientifically proven feel-goods also.

In the book *Shinrin Yoku, The Japanese Art of Forest Bathing* by Yoshifumi Miyazaki, the various study results prove what common sense tells us. A walk in the woods reduces stress and boosts your immune system. Nature therapy, the term now used, is proven preventable medicine. I'm all for it.

Scientists in Japan and other countries study the physiological and psychological effect of forests on human health and wellbeing. The data gathered for the last 15 years along with the new ability to measure brain activity and nervous activity allows

us to have “evidence” that being amongst the trees is good for us. The only evidence I need is how I feel, but others like documentable proof.

According to the scientist author, “What started as an intuitive-based therapy has become an evidence-based therapy and can now be considered a preventative medicine.” Super. In my lay terms, it feels good so do it.

It is no secret that many illnesses

are brought on by stress which lowers our immune system. From the common cold to weight gain to lack of sleep to depression and even heart disease and cancer, reducing stress can reduce risk. How can you reduce stress? Go out in nature.

The science has measured these direct benefits of forest therapy:

-Improvement of weakened immunity, with an increase in the count of natural killer (NK) cells, which are known to fight tumors and infection

-Reduction of blood pressure after only 15 minutes (spend one day in the forest and feel the benefits for the next 5 days)

-Reduction of sympathetic nervous system activity and increased parasympathetic nervous system activity which translates to increased

relaxation in the body and reduced stress felt in the body

I don't live in a forest, but I have learned that I need trees in my environment. Green space is my happy place.

It never occurred to me that Japan was so green. I think of busy crowd Tokyo when I think of Japan. (Japan is one of the most densely populated countries, yet 69% is covered in forest.) The Japanese people have a reverence for nature and Japan is the leader of nature therapy research.

You don't have to go to Japan nor too far, no matter where you live, to find some green space. A park will do. Take a walk. A slow stroll. No phone. Just wander. For two hours. Yes, you can do that.

My own “study” has revealed that when my Prince and I go for hikes or

nature walks, we simply feel better. Calm and happy. If you can't fit in two hours just yet, take 20 minutes and go for a leisurely walk. Breathe in the air. Notice your surroundings. See the beauty.

When you consider these walks are actually preventative medicine, it is even more motivation to do so. Do your own experiment. Notice how stressed you feel before your walk and after your walk. Notice how you feel as you incorporate more walks into your schedule.

So simple, so effective.

Let's all do more forest bathing!

mostly for the St. Louis Cardinals throughout the 40's. He was able to play in three World Series with them in 42, 43 and 44. Later he was traded to the Yankees and played with them in two more World Series. His best year was in '44 when he was voted into the all-star game for the National League.

On a side note, it's great to see the Brewers and Cubs in another dog – fight this year for the National League Central Division Championship. Last year the Cubs overtook the Brewers in the second half of the season and won the Division. This year it seems as if the Brewers might be a little tougher to overtake. They've added some good depth to their team over the winter, and that should help them when the battle begins to rage throughout the rest of the season.

God tells us that our lives can only stay strong in the Lord when we make

him our foundation. Like a good baseball team, our lives are stronger the deeper we are. This is done through making a conscientious effort to be thankful each and every day. Fried Bologna Cups

Yield: 8 bologna cups

Vegetable oil spray

8 slices beef bologna

Potato-Vegetable Filling (enough for one bologna cup):

1/4 cup mixed vegetables

1/4 cup mashed potatoes

1 tablespoon grated cheddar cheese

Apple Salad Filling (enough for one bologna cup):

3 tablespoons chopped apple

2 teaspoons minced celery

1 teaspoon golden raisins

2 teaspoons light mayonnaise

1 teaspoon plain, low-fat yogurt

Spray large, nonstick skillet with vegetable oil spray. Set skillet over medium heat and lay bologna slices in pan, as many as will fit in one layer. Let bologna fry until it cups. Transfer cups to serving plate and fry remaining bologna in same fashion.

To make Potato-Vegetable Filling: In small, microwave-safe bowl, stir together vegetables and potatoes; microwave until hot.

To make Apple Salad Filling: In small bowl, stir apple, celery, raisins, mayonnaise and yogurt.

Spoon desired filling into each cup. For cups with Potato-Vegetable Filling, top with grated cheese.

When serving young children, cut any circular-shaped foods like grapes, carrots or hot dogs into thin, coin-shaped slices or long, thin strips.

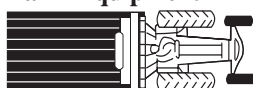
