In addition to Ronan's first place novice ribbon, the other two speaking awards were captured by senior Justin Malone, a 2018 State Finalist in Radio, who got second in, you guessed it, Radio Speaking, and up-and-coming sophomore Emma Beightol, winning fourth place in Novice Poetry Read-

However, even with the shortages, the team still finished at respectable 14 out of 22 teams. Actually, the total was 23, but because of time-honored tradition and professional courtesy, the host school does not include itself in what is referred to as the Team Sweepstakes.






Parkinson-Ganzer







The not so skinny cook

It's beginning to look like Christmas—yes, it is everywhere we go. went shopping, and I have been baking too. I found the Christmas music station on the radio—103. 1, and I am getting ready for next week. Since this column will come out as the last one before Christmas, there are some good recipes—an appetizer, a salad, a good side, a main dish, and two elegant desserts.

These mushrooms are listed as the best stuffed mushrooms ever-if you look at the recipe, it has bacon, cream cheese, Parmesan and mushrooms. You really can't get better than that because mushrooms take on the flavor of everything else. Use these for a Christmas appetizer, or you can save them for New Year's Eve too.

Stuffed Mushrooms

3 slices bacon

4 oz. cream cheese, softened

4 T. Parmesan cheese, divided

½ t. Worcestershire sauce

½ t. pepper

1 lb. button mushroom caps

Preheat the oven to 350. Cook the bacon in a large skillet, turning occasionally, until crisp and evenly

paper towels; crumble when cooled. Stir the bacon into the cream cheese, adding 2 tablespoons of parmesan cheese, Worcestershire sauce, and pepper in a large bowl. Spoon filling into the mushroom caps, using about 1 teaspoon filling per cap. Place in a 9 x 13 baking dish. Sprinkle with remaining parmesan. Bake until mushrooms are tender and filling is golden brown, about 25 to 30 minutes.

This salad has a lot of fruits in it. It is a little more than just the cranberry relish. I like the crunch of apples (my favorites are Gala, Fuji, or Granny Smith). I can't have bananas, so I leave them out. There is only a little preparation involved. Enjoy this refreshing fruit salad at your Christmas

Festive Cranberry Fruit Salad

1 lb. (12 oz.) fresh or frozen cranberries

1/4 C. water

½ C. sugar

5 medium apples, diced

2 medium firm bananas, sliced

1½ C. fresh or frozen blueberries, thawed

1 can (11 oz.) mandarin oranges, undrained

1 C. fresh or frozen raspberries, thawed

1/4 C. strawberries, halved

In a large saucepan, combine the cranberries, water, and sugar. Cook and stir over medium heat until berries pop, about 15 minutes. Remove from heat and cool slightly.

In a bowl combine the remaining ingredients. Add cranberry mixture and stir gently. Refrigerate until

for Christmas dinner? This sweet potato and squash recipe is really tasty. The use of evaporated milk, butter, brown sugar and the pumpkin pie spice makes for an interesting 'dressing" or sauce for special occasion vegetables. If you are not a nut lover, omit the pecans.

Sweet Potato and **Butternut Squash** Casserole

3 medium sweet potatoes, halved lengthwise

1 small butternut squash, halved lengthwise and seeded

¹/₄ C. plus 2 T. firmly packed light brown sugar, divided

½ C. evaporated milk

5 T. butter, melted and divided

2 eggs, lightly beaten

1 T. lemon juice

½ t. pumpkin pie spice

¼ t. salt

1 C. pecans

Preheat the oven to 425. Spray a large rimmed baking sheet with cooking spray. Place sweet potatoes and squash cut side down, on prepared pan. Bake until a sharp knife can be easily inserted in center, about 45 minutes. Let stand at room temperature until cool enough to handle. Reduce oven temperature to 350.

Scoop pulp from sweet potato and squash and place in a large bowl. Add ¼ C. brown sugar, evaporated milk, 4 tablespoons melted butter, eggs, lemon juice, pie spice and salt. Beat with a mixer at medium speed until smooth.

Spray a shallow 2 quart baking dish with cooking spray. Spoon the mixture into the dish and bake for 20 gether the pecans, 2 tablespoons of brown sugar, and 1 tablespoon melted butter. Sprinkle over casserole. And bake until the mixture is set, about 20 minutes more.

What I like about serving ham balls for Christmas dinner is that you can make them several days ahead of time or even put them in the freezer. (I put the glaze on after taking them and unthawing from the freezer.) You have an easy couple of days before Christmas without having to do the main dish prep the day of the big event. You get to enjoy family the sweet potato casserole and you can do most preparation way ahead of time.

1 lb fully cooked ground ham

1 lb. ground pork

1 C. milk

1 C. crushed cornflakes

1 large egg, slightly beaten

Holiday Snowflake Cake

2 eggs plus 4 egg yolks 1½ C. sugar 1 C. whole milk ½ C. butter, cubed 21/2 C. flour

This beautiful cake is gorgeous

1¾ C. sugar ½ C. water 4 egg whites ½ t. cream of tartar 1 t. vanilla 2 C. sweetened shredded coconut

In a large bowl, beat the eggs, egg yolks and sugar until light and fluffy, about 5 minutes. In a small saucepan, heat milk and butter until butter melts. Combine flour and baking powder; add to the egg mixture alternately with milk mixture. Beat until well mixed. Add vanilla. Fold in nuts.

1 T. baking powder

½ C. chopped pecans

1 t. vanilla

Frosting

Pour the batter into three greased 9 inch round baking pans. Bake at 350 until a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean about 15-18 minutes. Cool in pans 10 minutes before removing to wire racks to cool completely.

Frosting: in a saucepan combine sugar and water. Bring to a boil; cook over medium-high heat until a thermometer reads 244. Meanwhile, beat egg whites and cream of tartar on high speed until foamy. Slowly poor hot sugar syrup over the egg whites while beating continuously. Continue beating on high until stiff glossy peaks form, about 7 minutes. Add the vanilla; beat until the frosting cools slightly and reaches the desired consistency.

Place one cake layer on a serving plate, spread with 34 cup frosting. Sprinkle with 1/4 cup coconut. Repeat layers. Top with remaining cake layer. Frost top and sides of cakes with remaining frosting and sprinkle with remaining coconut.

If the preceding recipe is too hard to make, this next one is simple and delicious. It also is really pretty in a trifle bowl. If you don't have a trifle bowl, use a large glass bowl. It is really pretty and tastes great too!

Irish Crème **Chocolate Trifle**

1 pkg. devil's food cake mix regu-

1 C. refrigerated Irish crème nondairy creamer

2½ C. 2 % milk

2 pkg. (3.9 oz. each) instant chocolate pudding mix

3 C. whipped topping

12 mint Andes candies, chopped

Prepare and bake the cake mix according to package directions using a 9 x 13 pan. Cool pan on a wire rack for 1 hour. With a fork or wooden skewer, poke holes in cake about 2 inches apart. Slowly pour creamer over the cake; refrigerate, covered for

In a large bowl, whisk the milk and pudding mixes for 2 minutes; let stand until soft-set about 2 minutes. Cut cake into 1½ inch cubes. In a 3 quart trifle or glass bowl, layer a third of each of the following: cake cubes, pudding, whipped topping, cake cubes, pudding, whipped topping and candy. Repeat layers twice. Refrigerate trifle until serving.


