





Pineapple Pretzel Fluff

1 C. coarsely crushed pretzels ½ C. butter melted

1 C. sugar, divided

1 pkg. (8 oz.) cream cheese, softened

1 can (20 oz.) unsweetened crushed pineapple, drained

1 carton (12 oz.) frozen whipped topping, thawed

Preheat the oven to 400. Mix pretzels, melted butter and 1/2 cup sugar in a bowl. Press into a 9 x 13 pan. Bake 7 minutes. Cool completely on a wire rack. Melt butter with oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Add garlic; cook, stirring, until fragrant, about 1 minute. Add asparagus, cook, stirring occasionally, about 10 minutes. Transfer asparagus to a serving plate and sprinkle with Parmesan, salt and

We finally get to the leftover ham part of the column. This potato soup recipe is an easy one to make, and it is just the right thing for the leftover ham. I always use low sodium chicken and beef broth; it is easier to add salt than to get rid of too much salt. The ham is usually salty, so it is real-

ly important not to add any more salt.

Cheesy Ham and Potato Soup

- 2 T. unsalted butter
- 1 C. diced onions
- 1 T. minced fresh garlic
- 2 T. flour
- 4 C. peeled and diced russet potatoes
- 3 C. chicken broth, low sodium
- 2 C. diced, cooked ham
- 1 C. half and half
- 1 lb. sharp Cheddar, shredded
- ½ C. chopped parsley

Salt and pepper to taste

Melt the butter in a pot over medium heat. Add onions and garlic;

sweat until onions soften, about 5 minutes. Stir in flour; cook 1 to 2 minutes. Add potatoes and cook. stirring, one minute. Stir in broth and ham and bring to a boil; reduce heat to medium-low and cook until potatoes are fork tender, about 10 to 15 minutes. Coarsely mash the potatoes, then stir in half and half; stir in cheddar a handful at a time, letting each addition fully melt before adding the next. Off heat, stir in parsley and season with salt and pepper

This next two ham recipes are great for a quick main meal at night. You cook both on the cook top. In the first one, you can use dry white wine (½ cup) and chicken broth (½ cup) instead of just using all chicken broth. The second one has a creamy base. Serve the pasta with a salad and bread, and you have a hearty supper after work or school.

Ham Pasta

8 oz. shell pasta, cooked according to directions

- 3 T. unsalted butter
- 2 C. cooked ham, diced
- 2 C. frozen green peas
- ¹/₄ C. sliced green onions
- 1/4 t. red pepper flakes
- 1 C. chicken broth, low sodium
- ½ C. grated Parmesan
- ½ C. chopped fresh mint
- Salt and pepper to taste

Cook the pasta according to package directions and drain, reserving 1 cup of pasta water. Melt butter in a skillet over medium-high heat; add ham and sauté until beginning to brown, about 4 minutes. Add peas, onions and pepper flakes; cook until peas thaw and onions softens, about 3 to 5 minutes. Deglaze the pan with ½ C. broth, scraping up any brown bits; simmer until nearly evaporated, about 3 minutes; add rest of the broth and bring to a simmer. Off of the heat, stir in pasta, Parmesan, and mint; add reserved pasta water to reach desired consistency, and sea-



Rhubarb Dream Bars

2½ C. flour 2/3 C. powdered sugar

1 C. butter

3 eggs, lightly beaten 2 C. white sugar

1½ t. salt

5 C. sliced fresh or frozen rhubarb, thawed

Preheat the oven to 350. Mix together 2 cups flour and the powdered sugar in a large bowl. Cut in butter until small crumbs form. Press into bottom of a 9 x 13 baking dish. Bake 10 minutes. Meanwhile, whisk together eggs, white sugar, remaining ½ cup flour and the salt in the large bowl. Stir in rhubarb mixture evenly over crust. Bake until set and lightly browned, 40 to 45 minutes. Let cool in baking dish on a wire rack. Cut bars into squares and serve with ice cream. Bars keep up to 3 days chilled in an airtight container.

I promise this is my last carrot cake recipe for a long time! I really liked this one because of the cinnamon glaze. Enjoy it in cupcake form rather than the traditional cake form.

2 2/3 to 3 C. powdered sugar For Glaze

1 can (8 oz.) crushed pineapple,

1 C. powdered sugar

½ to 1 t. cinnamon

2 to 3 T. buttermilk

Muffins: Preheat oven to 375. Lightly grease muffin cups or line with paper liners. Mix together flour, baking powder, pumpkin pie spice, and salt in a large bowl. Mix in coconut, brown sugar, and white sugar. In a separate bowl, stir together eggs, carrots, pineapple, oil, buttermilk, and vanilla. Make a well in the middle of the dry mixture; add the wet mixture and stir just until combined. Fill muffin cups three-quarters full.

Bake until tops spring back when lightly tapped, about 25 minutes. Cool in pans 10 minutes. Remove from pans and cool completely on a wire rack.

Frosting: Beat cream cheese, butter, and vanilla in a large bowl with an electric mixer until light and fluffy. Gradually add and beat in enough powdered sugar to reach spreading consistency.

Stir together powdered Glaze: sugar, cinnamon, and buttermilk in a small bowl. Stir until smooth. Frost cooled muffins and drizzle with glaze.
