Orangeville teams show early season strength

Orangeville Tops Galena

Last Saturday, the Orangeville Broncos football team hosted the Galena Pirates in what would turn out to be a defensive battle through the finish. The Broncos came into the week three matchup with a record of 1-1, while the Pirates were looking to get their first win as they were 0-2.

The Broncos got the first score of the game when none other than Garret Rodebaugh plunged into the endzone for a two yard touchdown run. Orangeville would miss the twopoint conversion. That would not matter, however, as that first quarter score turned out to be the only touchdown of the game. The score would remain a 6-0 Broncos lead until the fourth quarter when they managed to extend the margin to a two score game when Zach Baker nailed a 33 yard field goal. The Field goal gave the Broncos a 9-0 lead that they held onto until the very end.

The Broncos tried to air it out a little more in this one but weren't always successful. Quarterback, Jack Doyle completed four of ten passes for a total of 28 yards. The ground game proved to be the team's strength once again in week three. Carter Kleckler led the team with 88 rushing yards on 22 carries, he also had three receptions for 29 yards putting him over the 100 yard mark for total yards. Rodebaugh rushed for 48 yards on 18 attempts, but one of those runs proved to be the difference maker in this one as the only touchdown of the game.

The Broncos defense was impressive once again, holding the Galena Pirate's offense to just 127 yards on the day. Kleckler was the leading tackler with eight total tackles. They forced five total turnovers for Galena, four of which came by fum-

interception. Bowen, Baker, Anderson, and Guy each recovered a fumble in the win. The defensive shutout was a big reason they pulled off the victory.

Now sitting at 2-1, the Broncos will be on the road this week when they face off with Pecatonica on Friday, Sept. 20.

Lady Broncos Impress against Amboy

Last Thursday, the Orangeville Lady Broncos' volleyball squad hosted the Amboy Clippers for a Northwest Upstate Illini Conference matchup. The Broncos came in with a 4-4 overall record, while they looked for their first conference win with an 0-1 league record. The Clippers came in at just 2-7 overall, with a 0-1 conference record.

The Broncos got off to a dominating start as they took the first set by a score of 25-12 as they doubled up their opponent. The second set seemed to feature a whole new team from the Clippers as they fought to keep things close until the very end of what would turn out to be a 25-22 victory for the Broncos. In game three, Orangeville had their eyes on the sweep and they wouldn't let anything get in their way as they rolled to another impressive 25-13 victory over Amboy. After completing the sweep the Broncos pushed their record above .500 at 5-4.

Hanna Diffenderfer gave the Amboy Clippers fits offensively all night as she racked up a whopping sixteen digs on the night. Tori Plowman was affective offensively for the Broncos with three kills and three aces. Cali Diddens had a great night as well, putting up seven kills and seven digs. Grace Edler had five blocks and four kills as the Broncos earned a great team victory.

League of Women Voters hosts 'Narratives from the Border'

The League of Women Voters of Freeport is hosting a public program, "Narratives from the Border," on Tuesday, Sept. 24, at 6:30 p.m. at St. John's United Church of Christ, 1010 S Park Boulevard in Freeport.

The presenter for the evening is Rockford Attorney Linda Zuba. Attorney Zuba is a human rights advocate who has been working and advocating for immigrants for decades. She has volunteered her time at an immigration center for women and children in Dilley, Texas and has

worked with asylum seekers stranded in Tijuana and other areas of Mexico as they wait to request asylum.

At the Dilley, Texas immigration center, Attorney Zuba helped women and children seeking asylum prepare for their "credible fear" interviews. She also helped them prepare materials for review by immigration judges. She has volunteered on three separate occasions in Tijuana, Mexico where she found thousands of asylum seekers in danger and desperate for help.

Attorney Zuba explains, "I have

promised asylum seekers I would share their stories about why they flee their home country and what happens to them once they request help." In addition to sharing asylum-seeker stories, she will discuss what people in her audience can do to be of assistance to people seeking asylum at the southern border.

All voters and interested members of the public are invited to attend Attorney Zuba's presentation and the following question and answer peri-

Chain Saw Safety Courses to begin next week

The Northwest Illinois Forestry Association (NIFA) will sponsor two Chain Saw Safety and Woods Worker (SAWW) courses in 2019: Tuesday, Sept. 24, Level 1 and Wednesday, Sept. 25, Level 2. This training is designed to teach novice and seasoned saw operators safe operation of gas-powered chain saws. All participants will be instructed in cutting and felling methods using the open-face directional notch and the bore-cutting techniques. Courses consist of classroom instruction and outside hands-on saw operation. Level 2 Session is open only to those who have completed Level 1 any time previously. Level 2 will feature advanced tree felling techniques and more hands-on time in the timber.

Topics to be covered

- safety and personal protective equipment (PPE)
- · saw operation, starting, safety features, and body mechanics
- · cutter tooth parts, basic saw maintenance, and chain filing
- saw reactive forces (push, pull, kickback, and attack)
- the 5-step felling plan
- the safe cutting of spring poles and limbing and bucking techniques. Cost and Registration

The not so skinny cook

A successful Fall Festival was held, and now everyone is cleaning up and resting up. The weather was perfect, and dare I comment on the fact that there were not a lot of bees. It was good for the Festival, but I wonder if it is bad for our environment. The parade was really great; there were many wonderful bands, a lot of floats, tractors, and commercial vehicles. You could hardly get into town. Tony had a lot of great pictures in this past week's paper and on the Shopper's Guide Facebook page; guess Fall has officially started.

This week's recipes have a combination of seasonal recipes and some good ones for all year round.

This salad is a combination of late summer vegetables. You can use frozen corn if fresh is not available, and you can substitute cherry tomatoes for the grape tomatoes. If you don't have rice vinegar, you can use apple cider vinegar.

Lime Confetti Salad

2 orange peppers, chopped

2 medium ripe avocados, peeled

1 container (about 11/4 C.) grape tomatoes, halved

1 C. fresh corn

½ medium red onion, finely chopped

¹/₄ C. rice vinegar

3 T. lime juice

2 T. olive oil

½ C. fresh cilantro leaves

2 garlic cloves, halved

2 t. sugar

½ t. salt

Fruit Salad with Poppy Seed Dressing

Dressing:

3 T. red wine vinegar

3 T. honey

1 t. orange zest

2 T. orange juice

½ t. salt

½ t. dry mustard

¹/₄ C. canola oil

1 T. poppy seeds

Salad 1 fresh pineapple, cored and

chopped 2 cans (11 oz. each) mandarin or-

anges, drained 1 C. red grapes, halved

1 C. green grapes, halved

1 C. quartered strawberries

Dressing: in a small bowl, whisk together vinegar, honey, orange zest, and juice, salt, and mustard until smooth. Whisking constantly, add oil in a slow, steady stream until combined. Stir in poppy seeds.

Salad: in a large serving bowl, combine pineapple, oranges, grapes, and strawberries. Serve with poppy seed dressing.

If you are tired of coleslaw and would like a use for a lot of cabbage, this unique roasted cabbage is a great side to roast pork or roast beef. It is very easy to make. Enjoy this different side for a fall dinner.

Roasted Cabbage

2/3 medium head green cabbage, cut into 4 wedges

1 T. extra virgin olive oil

1 t. garlic powder

½ t. pepper

½ t. salt

1/4 t. crushed red pepper

2 T. fresh lemon juice

Preheat the oven to 450. Spray a baking sheet with cooking spray. Place cabbage wedges cut side up

Place the first 5 ingredients in a on prepared pan. Drizzle with oil. macaroni; I like to use the large mac-In a small bowl, stir together garlic powder, pepper, salt, and crushed red pepper; sprinkle onto cabbage. Bake for 15 minutes. Turn wedges, and bake until tender, about 15 minutes more. Drizzle lemon juice.

I had a stuffed pepper recipe several weeks ago, and someone sent me this one that is just a little different. It uses Italian sausage. If you are a brave soul who likes spicy, you can use the hot Italian sausage. If you want a little spicier pepper, use green peppers. I don't think they are as mild as the yellow and red ones.

Italian Roasted Peppers

4 large red bell peppers

1 T. olive oil

1 lb. ground mild Italian sausage

1 small onion, chopped

1 C. chopped mushrooms

3 cloves, garlic, minced

3/4 t. salt

½ t. black pepper

1/4 t. crushed red pepper

2 C. pasta sauce

2 T. chopped fresh oregano or 2 t. dried oregano

1 C. shredded mozzarella cheese

Preheat oven to 350. Cut ½ inch off top of stem end of each pepper; discard seeds and membranes. If the peppers are not flat on the bottom, thinly slice the bottom to make it flat. Place peppers in an 8 inch square baking dish that has been sprayed with cooking spray. Thinly slice pepper tops.

In a large saucepan, heat oil over medium-high heat. Add sausage; cook, breaking up the meat into small pieces, until browned, about 8 minutes. Add sliced bell pepper, onion, mushrooms, garlic, salt, black pepper and crushed red pepper; cook, stirring occasionally, until tender, about 5 minutes. Stir in pasta sauce and oregano. Divide sausage mixture among bell peppers. Sprinkle with cheese. Cover with foil. Bake for 30 minutes. Uncover and bake until lightly browned, about 5 minutes

This recipe is a good one for a Sunday dinner or a main dish at night. It is easy to make, and it is delicious. A rotisserie chicken is about 4 cups of meat. You can substitute regular macaroni for the large elbow

aroni because it has big holes in the tubes to catch the sauce. You can get the large macaroni in larger grocery

Chicken Bacon Ranch Casserole 1 pkg. (16 oz.) thick cut bacon, cut

into 1-inch pieces

3 cloves of garlic, minced

4 C. heavy whipping cream 1 C. shredded Parmesan cheese

2 (1 oz.) envelopes ranch dressing mix

2 t. salt

1 t. pepper

4 C. shredded cooked chicken

1 pkg. (16 oz.) large elbow macaroni, cooked according to package directions

1 C. chopped fresh parsley

1 C. shredded mozzarella cheese

½ C. shredded sharp Cheddar cheese

Preheat oven to 375. In a large Dutch oven, cook bacon over medium high heat until crisp, about 20 minutes. Remove bacon using a slotted spoon, and let drain on paper towels, reserving 2 T. drippings in skillet. Add garlic to skillet, and cook until fragrant, about 1 minute. Gradually whisk in cream; bring to a low boil, and cook until slightly thickened, about 6 minutes. Add parmesan cheese, ranch mix, salt and pepper, whisking until cheese is melted. Remove from heat and sir in chicken, pasta, half of the bacon, and parsley. Spoon mixture into a 9 x 13 baking dish sprayed with cooking spray. Sprinkle with mozzarella, cheddar, and remaining bacon.

Bake until golden brown and bubbly, about 25 minutes. Let stand for 10 minutes before serving.

If you are a fan of Rice Krispy treats, you will like this different version with the white chocolate. This version is just as easy as the regular

White Chocolate **Cereal Bars**

4 C. miniature marshmallows

8 oz. (about 1 1/3 cups) white baking chips ¹/₄ C. butter, cubed

6 C. Rice Krispies

Using a Dutch oven, combine the marshmallows, baking chips and butter. Cook and stir over medium-low heat until melted. Remove from the heat. Add the Rice Krispies; stir to coat. Transfer to a greased 9 x 13 pan; gently press mixture evenly into pan. Cut into bars. Hint: grease your fingers before pressing because it is much easier to spread.

Need a cookie for the chocolate lovers in your life or maybe you are a chocolate lover! This "chubby" chocolate cookie will be just the right choice. The original recipe calls for one cup each of walnuts and pecans; I have an allergy to walnuts, so I use all pecans. I often have trouble finding espresso powder, so I use instant coffee. If you are able to get a dark roast instant coffee that would be







Chocolate Chubby Cookies

2 C. pecans, chopped

- 8 oz. Bittersweet bar chocolate, finely chopped
- 1 T. unsalted butter
- 1/3 C. flour
- 1 T. unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1 T. instant coffee or 1 T. instant spresso powder

½ t. baking soda ½ t. salt

2 eggs

1/3 C. sugar

1/3 C. packed brown sugar

1 t. vanilla

1 t. almond extract

1 C. semisweet chocolate chips

Toast pecans in a large nonstick skillet over medium heat until fragrant 5 to 7 minutes. Melt bittersweet chocolate and butter in a saucepan over low heat until nearly smooth; cool slightly. In a bowl, whisk together flour, cocoa, coffee, baking soda, and salt. In a large bowl, beat eggs, sugar, brown sugar, vanilla, and almond extract with in chocolate mixture, then flour mixture. Stir in nuts and chocolate chips. Cover dough and chill at least 2 hour or up to 1 day. Preheat oven to 350. Line baking sheet with sheets of parchment paper. Drop ½ oz. dough balls (3 t.) onto prepared baking sheets, spacing 2 inches apart. Bake cookies until slightly soft, 10 to 11 minutes. 


