Jo Daviess Conservation Foundation hosts Energy District forum

Everyone knows that technology is advancing with incredible speed. Solar power is one aspect of technology that is not only advancing rapidly; its presence in our lives becomes more obvious as more solar systems are being installed.

As the use of renewable energy becomes more widespread, questions about use and acquisition are increasing. In addition to citizens and businesses, questions and concerns about the use of renewable energy have arisen amongst groups involved with conservation, public land use, climate change and economic equality. Right now, there is no one single source for information or guidance.

On Dec. 5, 2019 the Jo Daviess Conservation Foundation (JDCF) hosted a forum, chaired by Steve Barg, Executive Director of JDCF, covering the concept of Energy Districts. The forum was the joint effort of JDCF and the Clayton County Iowa Energy District. JDCF had previously been approached by Joleen Jansen, Program Manager for the Clayton County Energy District about taking on a role as the first energy District in Illinois.

Considering the scope of work and commitment involved in operating an energy district, JDCF believes that an Energy District should be a singular organization. JDCF believes, however, in the interests of conservation they should help facilitate the

Daviess County.

Joleen Jansen presented a history of the Clean Energy Districts of Iowa and how it works. Jansen said, "About a year ago there were 4 energy Districts in Iowa. Today, there are 10. We're hoping to continue adding Districts and we believe it's possible to develop a network of local Districts in the 4-state area of Iowa, Illinois Wisconsin and Minnesota.

"The vision of our Energy Districts is to provide 100 percent local, renewable clean energy by the year

"Energy Districts should be modeled after the 3000 Soil and Water Conservation Districts (SWCD) in the United States. The four key principles of the District are local leadership, assistance with energy planning and technical assistance to provide locally owned power generation, help green meet green by assuring that locally owned companies can create renewable jobs, create and retain local prosperity and insure fair access to clean non-fossil fuel energy at reasonable cost."

At present, 80 percent of energy costs leave local economies. The creation of local solar power generation creates local jobs that return business to local economies. The less people pay on electric bills, the more money that can be spent locally. The Energy District, acting much as a SWCD might, can put energy companies together with local contractors, aid the public, businesses, and local govformation of an energy district in Jo ernment with energy planning. There

would be a positive ripple effect, economically while at the same time, solar energy would have a positive impact on the environment.

As for leadership, like a SWCD, the Energy District would have an elected Board of Directors made up of county residents and functioning as a quasi-government agency. A 501(c)(3) nonprofit status being required.

This is not just a matter of local energy; it involves a wide range of is-

Another meeting to explore the development of an Energy District is tentatively scheduled for January 23, 2020. Time and place will be determined.

Meanwhile, Hendrica Regez, Jo Daviess County Board member, is Steve Barg said, "We need people trying to pull together an alliance of

to step up and take on this challenge. conservationists, farmers environmental groups, alternative agriculture growers and others. The alliance will be named the Galena Country Sustainability Alliance. This group could possibly act as an umbrella, providing a new Energy District 501(c)(3) status. 



The not so skinny cook

My prediction was correct: we did need that heavy winter coat because we got cold weather. I am hoping it was a phase and not a way of life for a long time. Christmas is charging forward, and a lot of us are cooking more than usual. This week's recipes have a nice appetizer for before Christmas dinner, a tried and true salad, an easy vegetable, a main dish, and lots of sweets.

This appetizer is really easy. Go for the rotisserie chicken (because it is good and it is easy!) and use your favorite buffalo sauce. It is also a pretty appetizer on a plate. You can jazz it up with a little shredded cheese or chopped olives.

Chicken Logs

1 C. finely chopped cooked chick-

3 T. sour cream

2 T. buffalo wing sauce

4 (10 inch) celery stalks

¹/₄ C. Ranch dressing

Mix the chicken, sour cream and wing sauce in a bowl until blended. Spoon into hollow centers of celery sticks. Cut each stalk into 4 pieces. Drizzle evenly with ranch dressing.

This is one of my favorite salads. It is just right for Christmas. We have made it forever in my family. I haven't made it for a while, and someone asked me to bring a gelatin salad to my card club. I decided to do this one. I can't wait to taste it!

Raspberry Salad

1 large raspberry Jell-O

1 large pkg. frozen raspberries

2 C. boiling water

1½ C. applesauce

Topping

½ pint of whipping cream

1 pkg. (8 oz.) cream cheese, softened

1 t. sugar

1 t. vanilla

Pour boiling water over Jell-O. Add raspberries and applesauce. Pour into a serving dish and let set in refrigerator overnight.

Before serving whip the cream un-

til stiff and stir in sugar and vanilla. In a separate small bowl, whip the cream cheese and then add to the whipped cream. Place topping over top of salad and serve. This salad can be easily made for diabetics. Use sugar free Jell-O and natural applesauce for the salad. I use Equal in the topping.

Are you looking for a great side for Christmas Dinner? This simple vegetable is easy to make and really tasty. Sometimes you have to move away from green bean casseroles on holidays!

Butter Peas and Mushrooms

2 T. unsalted butter

pkg. (8 oz.) mushrooms, sliced small white onion, sliced

1 pkg. (13 oz.) frozen sweet peas, thawed

1 C. chicken broth

½ t. salt

½ t. pepper

In a medium skillet, melt butter over medium heat. Add mushrooms and onions; cook until onions are tender. Add peas, broth, salt and pepper; bring to a boil. Cover and remove from heat; let stand for 5 minutes.

I haven't had this meat dish for years. Someone suggested that I put a recipe for Swedish meatballs in the column. They would be a great meat dish for the holiday season and can be made ahead of time.

Swedish Meatballs

2/3 C. plus 1 C. evaporated milk, divided

2/3 C. chopped onions

1/4 C. fine dry bread crumbs

½ t. salt

½ t. allspice

Dash of pepper

1 lb. ground beef

2 t. butter

2 t. beef bouillon granules

1 C. boiling water

½ C. cold water

2 T. flour

with onions, bread crumbs, salt, allspice, and pepper. Add beef and mix lightly. Refrigerate until chilled. With wet hands, shape meat mixture into 1-inch balls. În a large skillet, heat butter over medium heat. Brown meatballs in batches. Dissolve bouillon in boiling water. Pour over meatballs; bring to a boil. Cover and simmer for 15 minutes.

Stir together cold water and flour. Remove meatballs from skillet; skim fat, reserving juices. Add the flour mixture and remaining evaporated milk to pan juices; cook, uncovered, over low heat, stirring until sauce thickens. Return meatballs to skillet. Stir in lemon juice. Place in a serving dish with sides so you don't lose any of the great sauce.

If you are looking for a great tasting fudge recipe other than chocolate, this one is for you. It has the wonderful brown sugar taste with toasted pecans. Enjoy this unique

Butter Pecan Fudge

1 t. plus ½ C. butter, cubed

½ C. sugar

½ C. packed brown sugar

½ C. heavy whipping cream

1/8 t. salt 1 t. vanilla

2 C. powdered sugar

1 C. coarsely chopped pecans,

Line an 8 x 8 pan with foil; grease foil with 1 t. butter. In a large heavy saucepan, combine the remaining butter, granulated and brown sugars, cream and salt. Bring to a rapid boil over medium heat, stirring constantly. Cook, without stirring, until a candy thermometer reads 234 (soft ball stage). Remove from heat. Add vanilla to pan and do not stir.

Cool, without stirring to 110 about 30 minutes. Beat with a spoon until fudge just begins to thicken, gradually stir in powdered sugar until smooth and then add nuts, continue stirring until fudge becomes very thick and just begins to loose its sheen. Immediately spread into prepared pan. Combine 2/3 cup evaporated milk Cool. Lifting foil, lift fudge out of

Remove foil, cut fudge into 1-inch squares. Store between layers of waxed paper in an airtight container. (To toast nuts: bake in a shallow pan in a 350 oven for 5 to 10 minutes or cook in a skillet over low heat until lightly browned, stirring occasionally.

Ginger cookies are always a hit during the Christmas season. I think they scream "It's Christmas!" These are pretty easy to make. The shortening makes them "snap.")

Cookie Jar Gingersnaps

³/₄ C. shortening

1 C. plus 2 T. sugar, divided

1 egg

¹/₄ C. molasses

2 C. flour

2 t. baking soda

1 ½ t. ground ginger

1 t. cinnamon

½ t. salt

Preheat oven to 350. Cream shortening and 1 cup sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in egg and molasses. In another bowl, combine the rest of the ingredients; gradually add to creamed mixture and mix well. Shape level tablespoonfuls of dough into balls. Dip one side into remain-

ing sugar; place 2 inches apart, sugary side up, on greased baking sheets. Bake until lightly browned and crinkly, 12-15 minutes. Remove to wire rack to cool.

This bar cookie recipe is very rich but really good. You can cut the bars in half to form triangles, and they will look great on the cookie plate.

Triple Chocolate Cheesecake Bars

1/4 C. butter, cubed

½ C. sugar 2 T. baking cocoa

½ t. vanilla

1 egg, room temperature

1/4 C. flour

1/8 t. baking powder

1/8 t. salt





The purpose of the LIHEAP Furnace program is to restore heat to the household and is available from October 1, 2019 through March 31, 2020 or until funds have been exhausted.

Priority periods for the LIHEAP Emergency Furnace Program are the following:

Starting Dec. 2, 2019 all income eligible households may apply for emergency furnace

To qualify for the LIHEAP Emergency Furnace Program, the household must first apply for and be approved for LIHEAP assistance.

The household must have active service with both primary and secondary heating utilities. Households and disconnected utilities are not eligible for this assistance.

In addition to LIHEAP documents, the following homeownership documentation must be provided:

1. Copy of real estate tax bill

- 2. One or more of the following:
- Copy of warranty deed, contract for deed, or quit claim deed (all of these must be stamped and registered with the county clerk)
- Copy of current mortgage statement
- Copy of the original Mobile Home title

½ C. heavy whipping cream 1 t. vanilla

Preheat the oven to 350. Line a 9 x 13 pan with foil, letting ends extend up sides; grease foil. In a microwave melt butter in a large microwave safe bowl. Stir in sugar, cocoa, and vanilla. Add the egg and blend well. Add the flour, baking powder and salt; stir just until combined. Spread into a thin layer in prepared pan. Bake until top appears dry, 6 to 8 minutes.

In a large bowl, beat cream cheese, sugar, and vanilla until smooth. Beat in cooled chocolate chips. Add eggs and beat on low speed just until combined. Spread over brownie layer. Bake until filling is set, 25 to 30 minutes. Cool 10 minutes on a wire rack.

For ganach: place chocolate chips in a small bowl in a saucepan and bring cream just to a boil. Pour over chocolate; let stand 5 minutes. Stir with a whisk until smooth. Stir in vanilla; cool slightly, stirring occasionally. Pour over cheesecake layer; cool in pan on a wire rack 1 hour. Refrigerate at least 2 hours. Lifting with foil, remove bars from pan. Cut into bars.

Illinois producers did you grow hemp in 2019? Are you interested in giving it a shot in 2020? With the end of the growing season here, there are many hemp growers who will be looking to find processors and end buyers for their product. As this is an emerging industry without a developed supply chain, there are a lot of holes to fill in. In response to this, University of Illinois Extension has created several production resources to help producers navigate this new industry which can be found here: go.illinois.edu/hemp.

First, Illinois Extension has created a "buyer/seller" database which will help connect hemp growers, processors, and end buyers in Illinois. Information will be filled out using the "Industrial Hemp Buyer/Seller Form" and will then be posted to a document labeled "Industrial Hemp Buyer/Seller List." Please note that this information will be public and as such you are able to enter the amount of information you feel comfortable with sharing. This tool may take some time to develop but is meant to help our growers across the state as a supply chain is developed. Similar tools have been shown to be effective in other states in which hemp production has been legalized.

Secondly, the University of Illinois Extension has created a "Needs Based Assessment" for industrial hemp production in Illinois. As this is an emerging industry, we are looking for the best ways in which we can serve our stakeholders, you! In order to help us with our research and extension efforts, we ask that you take the time to fill out this quick needs-based assessment to help us develop research trials and educational programs.
