Western Governors University Offers Opportunities and Scholarships to those Impacted by COVID-19

The COVID-19 pandemic has led to an increase in unemployment and job insecurity across our communities. While businesses slowly begin to reopen and people everywhere adjust to a new way of life, many who have been furloughed or laid off are still dealing with difficulties associated with lost

Those impacted may find that now is the perfect time to focus on building and strengthening skillsets needed to advance their careers. One of the best ways to do this is by furthering their education. Many put off earning an undergraduate or graduate degree for one reason or another but, given the current climate, may want to take the leap and work toward that goal online, from the safety of their homes.

Western Governors University is a leader in providing fully online education to adults who are interested in furthering their education and advancing their careers. Each needs-based scholarship is valued at up to \$3,000, and eligible students can apply online at wgu.edu.

This pandemic has proven challenging, especially for those out of work. But using this time to begin completing a degree could help open the door to more opportunities in the future.


