Old tractors still at work

This last week we had some great weather, and I was able to get out in the fields and get some oats drilled. Since I want a nice smooth alfalfa field next year, I chisel plowed the ground and then disced it twice to make it nice and even. Once I had it all worked up, it was time to put the oats and alfalfa seed in the ground.

I had borrowed my brother's Case IH 285 Magnum tractor to do the chiseling and discing but that tractor was way too big for the drill, so we hooked up his International Farmall 1206 instead. Her shiny paint

and wide front end got my adrenalin pumping to say the least. I threw on my insulated coveralls and headed out to the field ready to roll.

There I was out in the open air the way we used to do it. There was no heater, no air conditioning, no gps control, not even a radio. It was just me, God, and the

great outdoors. I can't begin to tell you how nice it was to step back into time a little. It took me back to the late '60s, through the '70s and even into the '80s when we first bought and did so much farming with our International Farmall 706.

Our new 706 was shiny red and had a wide front end just like the 1206. It was our big boss tractor at the time. With it we pulled a five-bottom plow, a 14-foot disc and the haybine and chopper as well. It was our big tractor and did all the heavy lifting back in

A few years ago, however, she was pushed aside for

bigger tractors and machinery. a million bucks. There's At some point with limited use, she had engine trouble and then sat in the shed just waiting for the day of reckoning. After some debate by the family, instead of junking this old beauty, we had a rebuilt diesel engine put in her and then repainted last summer. Now we're just waiting on a couple more tweaks or I would have used the 706 to drill the oats with. That would have been fun.

Anyway, with great exuberance, I finished the field, completed all the end rows and headed back to the home farm feeling like

something special about watching those front tires turn in the rich black dirt.

My Dad used to use the M to drill and we would ride on the bench at the back of the drill when my Dad planted oats years ago. We would ride for a while and then hop off and run in the soft dirt with our bare feet. Those were some great memories.

I love thinking back on these memories. Have you ever wondered what the Bible means when it says in Luke 2:19 that after the angel spoke to Mary about her being God's chosen woman to bear

the son of God, she treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart?

Mary always remembered what the angel said to her that day, and she held on to his words even when Jesus hung on the cross. I wonder what their first conversation was like after Jesus was Resurrected back to life. I bet she pondered those words as well. The real guilt of grief

If grief itself weren't bad enough, she often is accompanied by another formidable beast. I've encountered him lately, and his name is guilt.

Before I go any further, please suppress your instinct to tell me I shouldn't feel any guilt because I loved fully, madly and deeply and went above and beyond to do whatever I could to help my husband.

I did. I know that. In my heart I know that 100 percent. And he knows it, too. To his core. I believe that fully.

But hear me out: guilt is real. Survivor's guilt, caretaker's guilt - both real.

Because what if it's true? When you are the sole person responsible for a loved one who is hospitalized (Thanks, again COVID) you have to make decisions. Big decisions. Big, important medical

decisions that you are,

quite frankly, incapable and unqualified to make.

And you aren't given much time. You don't have two weeks to ponder a decision, it's often made during a phone call or within less than a minute as a doctor lays out the scenario as best he or she can and leaves you with the end game.

I made decisions I never should have had to make. I encountered choices that never should have been thrust upon me.

But they were.

And, honestly, from the deepest recesses of my heart, I did my best.

I performed caregiving

tasks I never thought possible. I learned medical procedures I never thought I'd ever need in my wheelhouse. I watched someone slowly grow weaker and weaker and there was, seemingly, nothing I

But now I look back and wonder if there was something that I could have done or said.

Could I have asked more questions? Did I ask the right questions?

I advocated strong and hard – beyond my normal abilities, really, but could I have advocated more?

When I was finally allowed, I visited every day for hours on end. Was there more I should have been doing during that time? Why couldn't I save him?

The guilt is real people. I wrote a column a few weeks back about what to say to a person who is grieving. I left out one piece

of advice: Don't negate their feelings. Don't tell them they should feel one way or another because they do feel that way and their feelings are real and deep and worth acknowledging.

Guilt is often one of those feelings. We feel guilty for what we did or didn't do even if we have no idea what that might be. We feel guilty for not saying something, or saying too much.

We feel guilty for not

fully appreciating the beautiful life we had. We feel guilty for conversations we might have had or could have had. We feel guilty for being the one who survived. We feel guilty for everything and nothing and so much

I'm not saying it's right or correct to feel this way. Nothing about grief is right or correct.


It just is. And it is real. Please understand that. And please allow anyone you love who is grieving this Thanks in advance. I

know you only want to help. And you are.


